i. Effective July 1, 2026, for employees enrolled with more than one dependent, the allowance shall be \$1640 per month, or 85% of the monthly premium cost for the CalPERS Gold PPO plan (Region 2), rounded up to the nearest \$10, whichever is higher. All other tiers remain unchanged.

ii. Effective January 1, 2027, for employees enrolled with one dependent, the allowance shall be \$1700 per month, or 85% of the monthly premium cost for the CalPERS Gold PPO plan (Region 2), rounded up to the nearest \$10, whichever is higher, and employees enrolled with more than one dependent, the allowance shall be \$1730 per month or 85% of the monthly premium cost for the CalPERS Gold PPO plan (Region 2), rounded up to the nearest \$10, whichever is higher. The employee-only tier remains unchanged; and
