Re: Agenda Item D.3 - CEC Comments on Energy Performance Reach Code

Dear Members of the City Council,

The Community Environmental Council (CEC) is in strong support of Goleta adopting an Energy Performance Reach Code. While we are concerned it exempts ADUs and smaller homes, we understand staff's rationale for this and do not want to see further delay in passing this code.

All-electric buildings are typically more affordable to construct, as they eliminate natural gas piping and meters. They are healthier and safer to live in without gas combustion, and more efficient when coupled with high-efficiency electric appliances. All-electric buildings significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions, especially when powered by the clean electricity that is quickly ramping up in Goleta through Central Coast Community Energy's goal of 100% renewable electricity by 2030.

According to the Staff Report, natural gas usage in buildings accounted for 40% of Goleta's energy emissions. A Reach Code is a simple action that Goleta can take to reduce the usage of natural gas in the City. If California is to meet our ambitious Carbon Neutrality by 2045 goals, we simply cannot keep building new structures that utilize natural gas. While small amounts of renewable natural gas are available in California, these limited supplies should be used for hard to decarbonize sectors, like heavy industry, not for mundane uses of heating water and space heating in buildings.

Goleta can be an environmental leader by joining with other cities that have adopted Energy Performance Reach Codes, such as San Luis Obispo, Santa Cruz, San Jose, Palo Alto, Santa Monica, and others. We applaud Goleta for considering such a code and urge the City to move forward with this important climate and sustainability action.

Dear Members of the City of Goleta's City Council,

Central Coast Community Energy (3CE) supports the City of Goleta's climate leadership and is in support of the City's proposed Reach Code ordinance and its local amendments to the California Energy Code.

3CE is a California Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) load-serving entity whose mission is to provide reliable, affordable, clean electricity, and electrification programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) and strengthen our local economy. In 2019, the City of Goleta City Council voted to become a member of the 3CE Joint Powers Authority (JPA) agreement.

3CE's governing boards have identified electrification as a strategic goal, recognizing that all-electric buildings are cost-effective, highly efficient, provide cleaner indoor air quality, and provide substantially lower operational emissions than buildings that use natural gas appliances. We encourage the City and its local developers to continue to take advantage of current and future 3CE programs incentivizing electrification and the reduction of GHGs.

3CE's New Construction Electrification Program offers commercial and residential customers incentives to encourage new all-electric affordable housing, farmworker housing, and Accessory Dwelling Units. Developers in the City of Goleta could receive up to \$250,000 per project to help build new all-electric units within the city.
