DISCUSSION:

Parking Changes at Jonny D. Wallis Neighborhood Park

Changes to the parking lot at Jonny D. Wallis Neighborhood Park are going into effect this month, including no overnight parking and a maximum four-hour limit on parking. These changes were approved by the City Council in 2024. Temporary informational onsite signage and outreach will accompany the approved changes in an effort to keep park patrons aware of the updated regulations.

Wildfire Risk Reduction at Ellwood Mesa

Santa Barbara County Fire crews are continuing to reduce the risk of wildfire at Ellwood Mesa by removing dead trees throughout the grove and trimming overgrown shrubs near private properties. The work is funded by a \$1.7 CalFire grant the City previously received. A team of biologists is coordinating protection of nesting birds and other sensitive wildlife.
