SUBJECT:	Goleta Valley Library, City Librarian's Report	

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive a presentation from the City Librarian about the activities of the Goleta Valley Library, programs and events, and the status of various long-term initiatives.

DISCUSSION:

Following is a presentation to the Commission referencing operational activities at the Goleta Valley Library (Library). This presentation includes areas such as programs, statistics, grants, collection development, calendared programs, and events. This report covers Library activity during February – March 2025. A PowerPoint presentation is included as well (B.1 Attachment 1. Library Advisory Commission City Librarian's Report PowerPoint).

PROGRAMMING:

A variety of engaging programs for all ages were provided throughout the months of February – March across the Goleta & Santa Ynez Valley Libraries. As February is Library Lovers Month, themes were tied into several events to celebrate the love of reading and libraries that we witness patrons experiencing year-round. We also took time to acknowledge the perennial support of our team of volunteers, who support the library in a myriad of ways, at a Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast on February 21st.

In addition to community favorites such as the ever-popular storytimes, craft hours, and book clubs, these months saw several class visits who spent their field trips learning about and exploring the library. In total, during February and March 2025 Goleta Valley Library staff implemented a total of 78 programs that resulted in 1,680 interactions with community members. Programming is an essential part of realizing the library's missing by bringing community members together, connecting them with library resources and information, and encouraging lifelong learning and enrichment.

STAFFING:

Training

Goleta Valley Library and Bookvan staff participated in a training on March 9th to review various components of the transition to GVL Express, including the packing plan, relocation phase, reopening timeline, and programming schedule.

Open Recruitments

Recruitments are progressing to fill the vacancies below, including a new opening at Goleta Valley Library for a Part-Time Library Page. Existing recruitments are now in the interview stage:

REGULAR DAILY BUSINESS OF THE LIBRARY:

In February and March 2025, there were 26,275 visits to the library. Patrons accessed the public computers for internet, printing, word processing, gaming, streaming and more during 1,300 unique sessions. Over 364.25 volunteer hours were contributed by the library's teen and adult volunteers. The library was open for 379.5 hours.

SPECIAL HIGHLIGHT:

As of March 19th, stops in Goleta have now been added to the Bookvan route to allow patrons additional options for picking up their holds. The Bookvan can be visited at the Goleta Union School District parking lot directly across from Goleta Valley Library at 401 North Fairview Avenue on Wednesdays from 5:00 - 6:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. Staff also drive the Bookvan to the rotating storytime locations taking place throughout Goleta on Friday mornings, resulting in a total of three additional stops per week. Existing hours of service and routes in the Isla Vista community remain status quo.

GRANTS:

Zip Books

In fall 2024, the Library received notice that our application for the 2024/25 Zip Books Grant Program was approved. The Library was awarded \$15,327 in funding from the State of California, administered by the California State Library. The program officially launched at our libraries on February 14th, and after six weeks patrons have now submitted over 450 requests, resulting in \$6,716.06 of the award being expended.

This program's ability to extend the reach of library services during the relocation phase of the Building Forward project, when services are between sites, is particularly helpful in ensuring that access levels remain as high as possible.

Building Forward


