SUBJECT: Interviews of Candidates for the Mosquito and Vector Management District

of Santa Barbara County and the Historic Preservation Commission

RECOMMENDATION:

A. Conduct interviews for the Mosquito and Vector Management District of Santa Barbara County, and the Historic Preservation Commission; and

- B. Allow each Councilmember to announce the Councilmember's preferred candidate(s) for the interviewed position(s) in accordance Goleta Municipal Code Section 2.15.040; and
- C. Continue this item to the December 19, 2023, City Council meeting for approval of one Mayoral appointment to the Mosquito and Vector Management District of Santa Barbara County and one Mayoral Appointment to the Historic Preservation Commission.

BACKGROUND:

Mosquito and Vector Management District of Santa Barbara County

The Mosquito and Vector Management District Board of Santa Barbara County provides direction and governance to the District relating to vectors such as mosquitoes and rats and surveillance for vector-borne pathogens such as West Nile and St. Louis encephalitis viruses. Management services are provided to all lands, both private and public, within the enhanced services areas of Santa Barbara County and its political subdivisions. Mosquito and Vector Management District Board of Santa Barbara County: http://www.mvmdistrict.com/governance.html. The District is governed by an eight member Board of Trustees; three trustees are appointed by the City Councils located within the benefit assessment areas—Goleta, Santa Barbara, and Carpinteria—and five trustees are appointed by the County of Santa Barbara's Board of Supervisors.

The District's Board of Trustees meets on the second Tuesday of each month in Room 18 at the Santa Barbara City College Wake Campus located at 300 N. Turnpike Rd, Santa Barbara 93111, to discuss District business and authorize fiscal and operational activity.

Each person appointed by a City Council to be a member of a Board of Trustees shall be a voter in that city and a resident of that portion of the city that is within the district. (Health and Safety Code § 2022 (b)). Member must have experience, training and education in fields that will assist in the governance of the District. Except as provided in Health and Safety Code Section 2023, the term of office for a member of the Board of Trustees shall be for a term of two or four years, at the discretion of the appointing authority. Member must reside within the City of Goleta. Terms of office commence at noon on the first Monday in January.

Craig Geyer's term ends January 1, 2024. Mr. Geyer resubmitted an application to be reconsidered for re-appointment.

Historic Preservation Commission

The Historic Preservation Commission is authorized by Goleta Municipal Code Section 2.17.020 and is composed of seven members. The purpose of the Historic Preservation Commission is to act as an advisory body to the staff, the Design Review Board, and City Council on all matters pertaining to historic preservation. On October 18, 2023, Jean-Guy Dube notified staff that he would be resigning from his position on the Historic Preservation Commission. The term for Jean-Guy Dube would expire on June 30, 2026, the successful candidate would fill the unexpired portion of this term.

DISCUSSION:

In anticipation of the expiring terms for the Mosquito and Vector Management District of Santa Barbara County, and the Historic Preservation Commission, the City Clerk's office published requests for candidate applications on the City website, the Monarch Press, Channel 19, the local adjudicated newspaper, Facebook, GovDelivery Bulletins, various social media sites, and generated press releases.
