# Habitat Stewardship at the Goleta Butterfly Grove at Ellwood Mesa

There are two remaining community volunteer days in 2025 on November 15 and December 6 to help plant trees and native plants, and provide important plant care including installing irrigation, clearing planting sites, spreading mulch and monitoring trees. ### Wildfire Risk Reduction at the Goleta Butterfly Grove at Ellwood Mesa

Santa Barbara County Fire Department crews recently wrapped up seven months of work to reduce the risk of wildfire at Ellwood Mesa. The landscape is noticeably different, with large swaths of highly flammable downed, dead eucalyptus trees removed, accumulated piles of bark and branches pulled back from the bases of live trees, and standing dead trees cut down and processed. This work followed the City's permit requirements and Monarch Butterfly Habitat Management Plan. Although the County Fire crews are not expected to return until next year at the earliest, additional tree work requiring specialized equipment and tree climbers is anticipated to occur by the end of the year.
