Lt. Frank Vasquez, City of Goleta Chief of Police, spoke regarding the role of Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office in relation to ICE enforcement activities, and reiterated that the Sheriff's Office does not participate in immigration enforcement.

Julissa Pena, Executive Director of Immigrant Legal Defense Center, spoke in support of staff recommendation and urged the City Council to support legal representation and immigration services for community members.

John Schettler, Assistant Superintendent of Pupil Services for Goleta Union School District, spoke regarding Goleta Union School District's preparedness in the event of immigration enforcement activity and the District's protections for student and family personal information.
