Dear City Council,

I am writing to encourage the Goleta Council to vote "yes" on Sable oil pipeline opposition and the pro-electric building energy code. These two items would allow Goleta to continue its legacy as a premier environmentally-conscious city, leading the way as an example of a thriving city that continues to grow by being a good steward of its unique natural resources.

I encourage you to oppose the Sable oil pipeline because it is dangerous for Sable Offshore to reuse the corroded Plains Pipeline to restart drilling 10 years after the shutdown from the Refugio Beach disaster. This pipeline disaster resulted in catastrophic loss of wildlife and destruction of habitat, forever changing the ecosystem and causing human health issues for Goleta residents. The Sable oil pipeline would endanger our community and jeopardize the remaining unique native habitat and species in Goleta, while also jeopardizing Goleta's goals to operate on clean, renewable energy.

I encourage you to support the pro-electric building energy code. Although the all-electric reach code Goleta passed on first reading was overturned by two Trump-appointed judges, this new "energy performance" reach code should achieve similar results of bringing Goleta closer to running on clean, renewable energy. All-electric buildings are safer and healthier for residents and operate more efficiently than gas buildings. Supporting this reach code would prioritize human and environmental health. Although Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) and small homes should have been included in the proposed code for health, safety, and cost reasons, this can be added in subsequent revisions. Supporting this reach code would put us back on track for achieving our clean energy goals.
