DISCUSSION:

Habitat Stewardship and Wildfire Risk Reduction at Ellwood Mesa

The community is invited to plant trees and native plants, and provide important plant care including installing irrigation, clearing planting sites, spreading mulch and monitoring tree health at the Goleta Butterfly Grove during multiple volunteer days through December 6. These events are a fun way to help monarch butterflies, meet new people, and learn about the ecology of the Butterfly Grove. More details and sign-ups are available here:

Santa Barbara County Fire crews are continuing to reduce the risk of wildfire at Ellwood Mesa by removing dead trees throughout the grove and trimming overgrown shrubs near private properties. The work is funded by a \$1.7M CalFire grant the City received. A team of biologists is coordinating protection of nesting birds and other sensitive wildlife.
