SUBJECT: Consideration of a Proposal from the Goleta Valley Community Center

Organization to Repurpose the Existing Tennis Courts for Pickleball Use

RECOMMENDATION:

A. Support the proposal by the Goleta Valley Community Center Organization to repurpose the existing tennis courts for use as permanent pickleball courts; and/or

B. Provide alternate or additional direction to the Goleta Valley Community Center organization.

BACKGROUND:

The Goleta Community Center is a city-owned facility, managed by the Goleta Valley Community Center (GVCC), a non-profit organization. In 1994 the GVCC built the multipurpose courts, designed for use by tennis and basketball players. In the beginning, the courts were used for tennis instruction and pick-up play but saw more activity by pick-up basketball. In the last 15 years, it has been reported that most of the activity on the courts is an occasional pick-up basketball game and a private rental for softball pitching practice due to the courts having lights and perimeter fencing.

In 2019, GVCC staff worked with residents to create a temporary pickleball court on the existing basketball court. This system was operated similar to the temporary court system first established at Evergreen Park. The lines were temporary tape, and users had to check out the portable net system. The temporary court was met with high demand and was quite active until the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic shut down all activity.

As the State of California released guidelines to allow tennis and pickleball activity to resume during the pandemic, the need for pickleball space increased significantly. In the spring of 2020, the existing tennis courts were identified by GVCC staff and pickleball enthusiasts as a possible location to convert existing tennis courts to temporary pickleball courts. Members of the pickleball community joined forces to raise the necessary funds

to maintain the existing modified basketball court and provisionally convert the existing two tennis courts to four temporary pickleball courts.

The pilot pickleball court conversion has been well-received by the pickleball community. The temporary court conversion also included updated light fixtures, additional access gates to the north of the courts, a revised entrance walkway from the parking lot to the courts and a membership program facilitated through GVCC, with a reported membership more than 300 people. The membership program allows users to reserve a court from 8:00 am until 8:30 pm and has proven to be popular and well-liked.

DISCUSSION:

On Thursday, November 18, 2021, at a Special Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting, the GVCC presented their proposal for the Commission's consideration. The proposal, provided in Attachment 1, is to convert the temporary pickleball courts into four permanent pickleball courts and maintain the multi-use court which accommodates a portable pickleball court and basketball court. An updated version of the presentation provided to the Parks and Recreation Commission is included with this staff report as Attachment 2. In addition to updating the proposal and presentation in response to Commissioner and public comments, the GVCC has also included an analysis of pickleball within the City of Goleta which is provided as Attachment 3. This proposed renovation would allow the GVCC the opportunity to resurface the existing courts, install the permanent net system and paint permanent court lines. The pilot program has been running for more than a year and continues to be successful with significant demand for use. Fundraisers have been held in the form of clinics, tournaments and more. These events have attracted players from all over the central coast, with some coming from surrounding states.

The permanent adjustments to the courts would not only provide necessary improvements to the playing surface and fencing material but would also allow for more local and regional competitive opportunities. The existing court surface is over 25 years old, and areas are smooth, making it challenging for maintenance and users to play.

The noise from pickleball is an evolving issue experienced nationwide with very few options to consider when trying to mitigate the noise of the paddles, balls and the enthusiasm of the players. The GVCC has received some complaints from area residents and have been able to be responsive with adjustment to the hours of operation. Noise reduction options are evolving, and GVCC has communicated in their proposal about the installation of sound mitigation measures that are effective, reasonable for users and affordable.

To date, the GVCC does not feel that they have found the right product for this location. Some products are costly without proven benefit, while others require additional improvements to the existing fencing infrastructure to handle the weight of some of the proposed materials. At a minimum, GVCC staff has shared with City staff that they will be installing windscreen to the south fence, which currently has no materials besides chain link fence.

Meeting Date: January 18, 2022

At the Special Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting, there were 320 written comments (Attachment 4) and fourteen additional speakers that evening. The comments received prior to and at the meeting were nearly all in support of the conversion from temporary to permanent pickleball courts on the existing tennis courts. There were four comments received in writing prior to the meeting that were not in favor of the proposal, for various reasons (ex: noise, light, accessibility, other recreation needs). These four concerns were discussed at length in the meeting by numerous Commissioners. While there was a motion passed to support the proposal, during the line of questioning, many Commissioners had requested that the GVCC continue moving forward on other efforts. Specifically, there was a request to: 1) ensure that there is access to the courts by all area residents, regardless of ability to pay the daily or annual use fee; 2) ensure that play cannot continue on the courts after 8:30 pm; 3) consider uses on the courts other than pickleball or basketball (activities appropriate for the court surfacing); and, 4) to continue efforts to mitigate the noise concerns.

Prior to the Special Parks and Recreation Commission meeting on November 18, 2021, staff went above and beyond the City of Goleta's required noticing procedures and mailed notices on November 4, 2021 to over 500 residents/tenants within a 300-foot boundary from the parcel edges of the Goleta Community Center to ensure notification to neighboring tenants and residents. This noticing was in addition to the press release, website news posting, GovDelivery email notification system message, direct emails to interested parties previously requesting notification, a story on this topic in the Monarch Press and posting to all City of Goleta social media platforms.

The purview of the Commission was to evaluate the use and proposed conversion of existing basketball/tennis courts to permanent pickleball courts. The existing basketball court will be resurfaced and remain as a basketball court but will also serve as a multipurposed temporary pickleball court.

GOLETA STRATEGIC PLAN:

The proposal before the City Council does align with the City of Goleta's 2021 - 2022 Strategic Plan, with specific strategies and goals listed below:

City-Wide Strategy: Support Community Vitality and Enhanced Recreational Opportunities

> Strategic Goal: Support programs that enhance quality of life in the Goleta community such as recreation, public safety, human services and cultural arts

City-Wide Strategy: Return Old Town to a Vital Center of the City

> Strategic Goal: Support the continued vigor and vitality in Old Town

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The proposal provided by the GVCC Organization does not request any funds of the City. All costs associated with the proposal, as stated, will be covered by the Goleta Valley Community Center Organization through their fundraising and operations budget.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Council may choose not to accept the proposal, but if so, the City will need to allocate funding to a future maintenance project to resurface the existing courts which have exceeded their life expectancy. In addition to the court surface, there would still be a need to address the repairs to the perimeter fence to address holes, sharp edges and gaps at the bottom of the fence.

Proposal December 19,2021

The Goleta Valley Community Center, (GVCC) a 501c3 nonprofit organization, currently the managers of the Goleta Community Center Campus located at 5679 Hollister Ave in the City of Goleta, proposes to Convert the (4) existing temporary Pickleball courts into 4 permanent Pickleball Courts and one court, court #5 into a multi-use court for Basketball and Pickleball, the conversion to be done at no cost to the City of Goleta.

The outdoor courts are currently being used as temporary Pickleball Courts with one court, court #5 being used for dual sports of Pickleball and Basketball. The proposed changes include, resurfacing and painting the playing surface, striping the new surface for Pickleball on courts 1-5 with court #5 also being striped for basketball. The improvements also include installation of eight new permanently installed court net post and four nets for Pickleball on courts 1-4. Court #5 will have a portable net due to its mixed use of Pickleball and Basketball. Additionally, the GVCC would like to replace damaged chain link fencing on the divider fence between court #4 and court #5 and parts of the south facing fence. The changes/upgrades to the courts if approved will make them permanent Pickleball Courts. The GVCC has (3) bids on file from licensed contractors that specialize in court resurfacing and our hope is to begin work in early 2022.

Court History:

GVCC has been managing the Goleta Community Center property for over 40 years. We take pride in our work as the caretakers of this property, not just in maintaining the property but also for our vision towards the future. Over 25 years ago, in 1994 GVCC sought permission to build a multipurpose outdoor court to bring more recreational opportunities to the Community Center. Our request was sent to the County of Santa Barbara, the property owner and it was unanimously approved. The new courts were well received. A local Tennis Pro taught lessons and managed the courts for years, however as time went on there was more "pickup" basketball games than tennis use. Eventually, demand for tennis went away. The courts sat

underutilized for the last 15 years. The most significant uses were occasional pick-up basketball games and a request from a girls' softball pitching coach wanting to rent the courts at night for the Fall Season. She came to the GVCC as we had the only lighted courts for nighttime use.

Justification for Change:

The playing surface of the temporary Pickle Ball Courts is old and worn, with peeling and chipped paint and a playing surface that no longer has traction and has become slippery especially with dust and dirt on the court.

While the courts were originally built for tennis, they have not been used for tennis for over 15 years. Since being temporarily modified for Pickleball in early August of 2020 the courts have been active seven (7) days a week with heavy use in the morning and early evenings.

The courts were opened for play during the COVID 19 Pandemic. State and City of Goleta COVID 19 guidelines for safe play were established and posted on the courts and GVCC Web site. Players commented how good it felt to be outside playing a game they really enjoy with friends and family. Several commented that it was a mental health boost from the "stay at home" order during the pandemic.

These courts are contributing to health and wellbeing of those coming to play and they are a boost to the local economy especially when there are pickle ball clinics, or tournaments as those activities attract local players as well as players from out of county and in some cases out of state. Those people come and stay in our local hotels, and local RV Parks or campgrounds, they patronize our local restaurants and food markets as well as buying gas in our local service stations. The GVCC benefits financially from the tournaments, thru entry fees and court reservations, the funds received have allow the GVCC to make significant improvements without asking the City of Goleta for additional funds.

Five years ago, the City of Goleta shared with the GVCC management that they wanted to see more recreational opportunities on the Goleta Community Center Campus as well as more recreational value added to the property. They also wanted to see an improvement in the GVCC's ability to generate more income to reduce the city's need to subsidize GVCC's operations. The GVCC has delivered on both those city directives. The proposed changes when completed will attract more players, and because of the quality of the courts the GVCC will be able to host "sanctioned" tournaments bringing in top notched players from out of the area. Tournaments are weekend events, this means people will be coming to Goleta for an extended time, staying in local hotels, eating at local restaurants, and staying to see our local scenic spots. This will be a boost to the local economy and to the GVCC as the "host Site."

Recently the GVCC made a presentation to the City of Goleta's Parks and Recreation Commission, about our Proposal to refurbish the temporary Pickleball Courts making them permanent, their charge was to consider the GVCC Proposal to repurpose the existing tennis courts for pickleball use and provide a recommendation to the City Council related to the

recreation use compatibility based on community need and existing adopted City Parks and Recreation related plans.

The presentation was virtual with over 135 people logging on to the presentation and over 300 letters of support sent to the City of Goleta stating how important the courts are for the community and how important it is to have this outdoor recreational activity that supports not just individual physical activity but that the courts are a financial boost for the local economy. The community overwhelming supports pickleball and expressed their desire to have even more courts available. The CVCC Courts are a logical best choice for renovation, they are central to the community and located in a Commercial Zone as opposed to residential zoning, they serve a more diverse population than any other site, they have ample parking, and lights for night play.

The GVCC Pickleball Courts help keep our community vibrant and healthy! The GVCC management is committed to resurfacing the courts, painting the courts, striping the courts, having permanent net post and nets installed, replacing the damaged fence between Courts 4 & 5, and installing windscreen material on the south fence, all at no cost to the city.

Summary:

- The GVCC Pilot Pickleball Program has been highly successful.
- It's been a huge hit with the community, positive community response and the most widely used and supported courts in Goleta.
- Hundreds of users
- It's generated thousands of dollars
- It's brought public recognition to the Goleta Community Center
- It's supported by Businesses, Associations, and neighbors throughout old town
- The courts are filled daily with active vibrant visitors

We encourage the Goleta City Council to support our proposal to refurbish the existing temporary Pickleball Courts making them permanent, it creates the highest and best use for this city resource and it immediately allows the City of Goleta to meet community demand and deliver a service comparable to other area cities.

The GVCC and the USA Pickleball Association have collaborated to produce an Investigative Report, *Analysis of Pickleball Within the City of Goleta*, GVCC *Court Resources Report*. The attached report supports the GVCC's desire to renovate the existing courts and addresses the issues and concerns raised by the members of the Parks and Recreation Commission, it is included as a separate attachment for your review.





Situation and Consideration

This report provides a realistic view of Goleta's pickleball facilities, the condition of current resources and the most feasible options to meet the immediate needs of the community as they exist now and as they could evolve into the future including a review of the temporary facility at GVCC and the desire to reclassify that to a permanent dedicated pickleball facility. The information is based on a comprehensive process involving extensive research and review of the existing parks, playgrounds and zoning in Goleta, as well as input from staff, community and other stakeholders. It provides an assessment on pickleball nationally and locally within the City of Goleta. The trends and the expansive growth, how other coastal communities are meeting the demand relative to Goleta and how Goleta pickleball facilities compare to other central coast cities. Information is derived from, and recommendations align with those stated in: City of Goleta's General Plan/Coastal Land Use Plan, City of Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan, The 2017 City of Goleta Strategic Plan, City of Goleta Strategic Energy Plan, City of Goleta Climate Action Goals, The Citywide Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Initiative, as well as the goals and vision for GVCC to be a vibrant active resource for the community.

This report provides a comprehensive analysis to aid in long-term decisions regarding pickleball resources within the Goleta community, the information covers many aspects and extends beyond the scope of this initial meeting which is merely a decision to reclassify the single tennis court facility located at GVCC to 4 dedicated pickleball courts and determine what additional improvements are needed at that location. The 4 courts at GVCC have been operating on a pilot program to evaluate the ability of the GVCC facility to meet current needs of the community. The program has been widely accepted by the community adding new life to GVCC and Old Town. Given the success GVCC facility a reclassification from tennis to pickleball will allow for the improvements for this to continue as a valuable community asset.

Within the City of Goleta there is an extremely high demand for pickleball facilities by the residents; however, there are a very limited number of courts. GVCC currently provides the largest number of pickleball courts throughout the City of Goleta, and it has now become the highest and best use for the GVCC facility. This pickleball facility is now used by more than 300 families on a regular basis and the courts are active every day. The single tennis court, which had not been used in 15 years, had suffered neglect, and was converted for pickleball use to evaluate community support. The community embraced this change and a recent Parks and Recreation meeting received over 400 positive and supportive letters with approximately 135 citizens in attendance. The public shared amazing stories of community, friendship, health improvements, how they rediscovered the charm of Old Town, the supporting of Old Town businesses, appreciation to the City for this resource, etc. all supporting a permanent/dedicated pickleball facility at GVCC. It was quite an amazing turnout and an unusual situation with the City receiving such praise and support from a courteous and overly polite mass of citizens promoting the best aspects of community.

Like tennis, pickleball has a national association and national standards as to court design, nets etc. The City has been thoughtful in the design of tennis facilities not only providing ample courts but ensuring the courts meet the national standards. The data confirms that to date the same consideration has not been provided to pickleball. There are very limited pickleball facilities within the City of Goleta and the City is falling far behind other central coast cities in providing resources to support the demand for this sport. Currently, the only 2 facilities classified for pickleball do not even come close to meeting minimum standards.

The demand and popularity continue to exponentially grow for pickleball, this report provides many of the reasons behind this growth trend and how it shall continue. A key factor is the ease of entry, almost everyone can play; and the social aspects create an environment whereby it becomes more of a fun activity rather than exercise. Unlike other sports and exercises pickleball exponentially grows because friends and family bring in more friends and family and it becomes a healthy activity that is described as "additive". Individuals will play several times a week and psychologically it is more of a social event than exercise. In response to this growth and high demand/need for resources many cities are building dedicated pickleball complexes with updated courts. This report provides details on the complexes being built around the central coast. Larger communities are even seeing businesses commercialize and take advantage of this popularity with franchising of a combination restaurant, bar and pickleball complex popping up all over the country.

Goleta as well as the City of Santa Barbara has also experienced a reduction in tennis players as they move toward pickleball. In response Santa Barbara has invested significant funds to build dedicated pickleball courts within the municipal tennis facility. They now have more pickleball courts than tennis courts and changed the name of the facility to the Santa Barbara Municipal Tennis and Pickleball Courts. The demand is expected to continue as population ages and younger players enter.

Unlike other cities, there really is no dedicated pickleball facility within the City of Goleta and it appears that GVCC presents the best opportunity. Further, GVCC presents a unique opportunity to continue to evaluate the demand and provide a valued resource while the City considers other dedicated options. Additionally, by virtue of location, the GVCC site offers access to this sport within the highest diversity within the community. Pickleball at GVCC has indisputably been an activity to generate more visitors to the community center and Old Town than any other activity in the history of the Community Center. Data supports that the City should embrace and invest in pickleball while examining how it can also help with the revitalization of both GVCC and Old Town.

The current city agenda item is a simple question of providing resources for pickleball to meet the high community demand. Which the master plan indicated as a growing trend and there is an indisputable need for pickleball resources within the City of Goleta. The City needs to add resources, not remove them, and this is easily accomplished by merely changing the classification of temporary courts at GVCC to permanent dedicated pickleball courts. This designation further provides the framework to make the needed improvements for safe pickleball play and to begin bringing the services up to par with other Cities.

The pickleball community along with GVCC has made significant personal investment of time, money and resources to support pickleball and bring this activity to the community. It has become a vibrant active resource that have brought life and hundreds of citizens and other resources supporting the Community Center as well as other Old Town business. Without this reclassification the result is a reduction in needed resources. When reviewing all options to provide pickleball resource, simply reclassifying and making an investment into the GVCC Facility offers the best solution and best use of the facility at this time for all stakeholders.

GVCC was an area identified as one of four facilities that is underdeveloped and should have an investment for sports resources. Also indicated in the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan it is important to "Routinely analyze the usage of the programs, facilities, and services and make appropriate adjustments based on collected data. The Division should routinely measure the amount of participation in its facilities and services to determine the levels of usage and identify any trends in this usage. With this data, the Division can make appropriate changes to its supporting facilities or agreements with program providers to reflect this demand." Like other cities, Goleta has experienced a change in usage from tennis to pickleball requiring adjustments to be made to meet community needs.

The GVCC pickleball facility has been widely accepted and utilized by the community. From usage fees and donations, the community has already invested approximately \$35,000 towards the facility over the past year. Based on a comprehensive review, a reclassification of the GVCC facility to dedicated pickleball use and an approval for the improvements will continue to satisfy the immediate needs of the community while the City can pursue additional evaluating additional resources.

Pickleball Overview and Unique Attributes

The City of Goleta, like other cities, should embrace and support the sport of pickleball and they now have the opportunity with this proposal to re-characterize an abandoned tennis court resource into an active vibrant pickleball resource. Municipalities are rapidly expanding pickleball facilities based on high public demand and the unique aspects of the sport for creating and fostering community, inclusiveness and diversity. Pickleball is the fastest-growing sport in America not just because it is fun, and good exercise, but because it is environmentally responsible, socially inclusive, and inherently safer than other active sports.

One of the few active sports where anyone at any age can start playing and be confident within a short period. Although pickleball can be energetic, it is contained to a small area, limiting the running and fast turning, thus making it easier for much younger and older players, or those with mobility concerns. Yet its activity is strenuous enough to give a solid aerobic workout, improving overall health. With its small footprint, pickleball is also environmentally responsible. You can place four pickleball courts on a single tennis court. You could place enough pickleball courts on a single soccer field to support an entire playing community for a long time.

Attributes of Pickleball:

- 1. Fastest growing sport and widely adopted/desired by the citizens of Goleta.
- 2. Pickleball offers and supports diversity more than most other sports.
 - a. Low cost: accessible and inclusive to all ages, races, just need a paddle which can be purchased for as little as \$25 new or cheaper used
 - b. Easy to learn and develop skills anyone can pick up a paddle and become a player
 - c. Disabled community members can also easily play and enjoy pickleball.
 - i. The USA Pickleball Association rules encourage and include players in wheelchairs and prosthetics
 - ii. The Goleta Chapter of Special Olympics located in Old Town is supportive of the pickleball facility at GVCC
 - iii. Goleta Parks and Recreation have limited resources for active disabled members of the community and pickleball provides that resource.
 - iv. Pickleball communities have supported veterans and their families who benefit from the sport
 - d. The Goleta Chapter of the USA Pickleball Assn is highly supportive and encouraging all community members from all backgrounds to embrace pickleball. This was a key factor in making an investment in the GVCC location vs other locations
 - e. The local Goleta pickleball community has actively supported the Boys and Girls Club children with free clinics, and even suggested providing access to free paddles/balls etc. however, their personal resources are limited and to date have not received support from the City which could help foster this environment.
- 3. Great health benefits: uses many muscle groups, forearms, biceps/triceps, leg muscles, bending frequently
 - a. Since pickleball is so easily played by all ages it promotes healthy active lifestyles which reduce illnesses including diabetes, heart, joints, arthritis, muscle atrophy, obesity, stress, etc.
 - Letters received indicated great support including recovery from heart surgery, cancer, and stress related issue.
- 4. Highly supported by seniors
 - Smaller court than tennis so all around easier movements for seniors so they can remain active.
 - Community input along with letters received highly support this attribute within Goleta.
- 5. Covid relief: pickleball expanded during 2020 due to above stated attributes. Players found relief from covid fatigue/stress and lack of regular exercise and social impacts from covid. Public comments express this over and over.
 - Community input along with letters received highly support this attribute within Goleta.
- 6. Goleta businesses support the GVCC pickleball facility: Businesses use pickleball for team building, destressing, socializing and hold competitions/tournaments between local companies.
 - Community input along with letters received highly support this attribute within Goleta.
- 7. Tournaments: Similar to soccer the sport is conducive for tournament play. Tournaments provide a revenue source through fees, bed tax, business and promote attributes of Goleta attracting visitors.
 - a. GVCC has successfully conducted small tournaments for fund raising resulting in over \$10,000 of incremental funds. The courts are ideally situated with an adjacent grass park supporting picnics, onlookers, etc.
- 8. Promotes and fosters community, Family, Social attributes: Families all play together, multigenerational: Grandparents and grand kids can play. A sport teenagers will play with parents.
 - Community input along with letters received highly support this attribute within Goleta.
- 9. Egalitarianism diversity/equality not found in other sports. Public input and court observations has shown that women, men, young, old regardless of age, race or economic status or body shapes/styles are all on equal playing fields and collaborate together during play and between games. Creating a unique environment in which players are not interested in what you do for a living or how much money you have they are all only interested in meeting each other and playing the game of pickleball.

- a. Locally UCSB students, cottage hospital nurses, teachers, engineers, retirees, residents from old town along with people passing through from out of town and other states are all stopping at GVCC for pickleball. Even Kenny Loggins has come to GVCC to play and so have some of the top national players.
- b. Letters received and public comments expressed how individual are making new diverse friendships and even some with disabilities have felt more inclusive playing pickleball.

Goleta City Mission/Goals for Parks

From the City of Goleta website: "The City of Goleta recognizes that local parks and recreation opportunities are an integral part of a happy, healthy, community and we strive to meet the needs of our residents. It has been a desire of the City to increase the amount of active recreation space within Old Town Goleta for many years and is an identified need within the City's strategic plan."

Recategorizing the abandoned GVCC tennis courts to dedicated pickleball courts helps the City of Goleta move more toward their mission to increase active recreation space.

Most of the Goleta parks are currently passive parks and there are very few active parks to promote good health, social environments, and family activities. Goleta has 28 neighborhood parks yet only 5 have any active characteristics (Exhibit 1). According to data within the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan these parks are underutilized, and the most widely used park is Girsh Park (a non-public facility) due to its support of active sports.

Most new parks built today are reflecting the active lifestyles and health movement that is throughout the country. Johnny D. Wallis Park, the newest addition has a multitude of recreational amenities and landscaping, including a multi-purpose field, basketball court, handball court, concrete ping-pong table, bocce ball court, pickleball court, perimeter walking path, fitness nodes with exercise equipment, picnic areas, skateboard plaza and soon to be added splash pad.

With hundreds of new families using the temporary pickleball facilities at GVCC it may have become the most widely used public facility for healthy active lifestyles. It has moved from an abandoned unused facility to vibrant active recreation space and if recategorized and supported as a dedicated pickleball resource it will establish the ability to make necessary improvements.

Goleta Pickleball Demand and Current Park Resources (Exhibit 1)

According to the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan, nationally, pickleball is one of the highest trending sports gaining an average eight percent growth each year. Locally, the sport has seen explosive growth, support and demand; however, the available court facilities provided within the City do not currently meet the demand.

The GVCC facility represents a supportive start and has the foundation to offer the community an excellent pickleball resource. The GVCC pickleball facility not only fosters good health and an active lifestyle for everyone in the community, but it is also the only facility that has lighting. The lighting enables the working-class community to engage in active recreation and enjoy exercise in the evening which is their only opportunity. For 5-6 month out of the year (nearly half the year) the sun sets prior to 6:30pm so having lights at a facility is a critical factor to promote active healthy lifestyles. Providing resources to this segment of the population has also been a key factor for hours of site availability and open play which currently seems to be working effectively.

Data derived from the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan indicate that based on the population of Goleta there is a need for 6.4 dedicated pickleball courts. In 2020 we saw an enormous increase in pickleball players including many tennis players moving to that sport. Based on the hundreds of public comments received and given the demand for the courts it is likely this number is severely understated and the City will not only need to retain and dedicate the GVCC courts to pickleball, it will likely need to look at adding additional resources to meet the popularity and demand for the sport. Based on public comments once players start the sport they will play on a regular basis for years to come, thus, investing in these courts would result in a good city resource.

The GVCC pickleball courts are the highest and best asset to fill that need; therefore, these courts should be reclassified to a permanent dedicated pickleball facility. The reclassification would additionally initiate a process and justification to make the needed improvements so the facility could meet City standards. The community has made a significant personal investment of time and money into the existing courts; however, a comparable investment from the City is needed in order to bring the courts to the equivalent standards of other municipal facilities. Although currently temporary, the GVCC pickleball courts are the most viable pickleball resources within the City (refer below to available pickleball resources).

 The GVCC courts are currently classified for tennis use; however, they were abandoned by the tennis community and have sat unused until revitalized by the pickleball community and turned into a resource used by hundreds of families.
 Additionally, for more than 12 months the temporary pickleball pilot program has been running successfully and there have been no requests to use the facility for tennis nor have there been requests to use court 5 for basketball.

- 2. Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan data indicates a surplus of tennis facilities, so the reclassification of these courts would have no impact on the tennis community. It further indicates a deficit and need for pickleball courts.
- 3. The pickleball courts at GVCC provide a better use of space than the tennis courts. The square footage of the court area in question was only able to provide 1 tennis court with maximum usage by only 4 players. The conversion to pickleball provides 4 playing courts within the same space and the ability to accommodate 20 players at a time instead of 4. Given the high cost of land the reclassification of 1 tennis court to 4 pickleball courts makes environmental and economic sense.
- 4. Table 5-1 shows resources for tennis as well as basketball are available from many of the public schools within Goleta as well as UCSB; therefore, the inventory for these resources is high relative to demand. This is likely a contributing factor for why the community was no longer using court facilities at GVCC. Although the City does not have an established joint use agreement with the school districts it is identified as an objective. The citizens do have access and ability to use these accessible resources for basketball and tennis even without a City joint use agreement.
- There are no other public pickleball facilities accessible within the City of Goleta (such as school or county resources) which creates a greater need for the reclassification of the courts at GVCC (refer below to available pickleball resources).

A reclassification of the GVCC courts to permanent dedicated pickleball courts and the support for improvements helps the City meets every aspect of the Goleta Parks and Playground Master Plan as well as the objectives and mission for the Community Center.

Shortage of Available Pickleball Facilities within Goleta

The demand for pickleball in Goleta far exceeds the resources and the demand is growing exponentially. Other than the GVCC location there exists very few public pickleball resources available within the City of Goleta. Those few other resources are currently not conducive to play and do not promote the environment seen at GVCC (see descriptions below). The City of Goleta is drastically trailing behind all other Cities on the central coast for providing quality resources to support pickleball (Exhibit 2). Many of the cities are building dedicated pickleball complexes to meet demand and use the unique aspects of this sport as a foundation to foster a healthy active community lifestyle. These complexes offer dedicated safe courts conducive to the game, proper fencing, court separation, permanent nets, lighting, ample parking, bathrooms, shaded bench areas, built at accessible locations for all members of the community. Some cities include food services/restaurants services at the complexes which compliments and has the same social aspects of pickleball as well as increases community involvement, usage, promotes good business and generates ongoing funding. These communities are including pickleball in their budgets and are also utilizing grant opportunities available from the State to kickstart their pickleball programs.

Similar to tennis, pickleball requires special court surfaces, nets, fencing etc. exclusively designed for play. Areas designated for tennis and pickleball should restrict use to these sports to maintain surface, equipment and safety. Activities such as skateboarding, roller skating, biking are frequently restricted around town for the same reasons. Without public funding and support the hundreds of families using the GVCC resources are forced to drive to other cities or those with financial means will join exclusive clubs.

Available pickleball facilities in Goleta:

Private Pickleball Facilities

- 1. Several area clubs and hotels provide upgraded courts which are in high demand. Pickleball is accessible to privileged wealthier residents who can afford memberships at private clubs. However, given the limited public facilities, pickleball is inaccessible to the lower income population and a lack of public resources can create inequalities.
- 2. Area residents with higher net worth and more resources also build courts or convert tennis courts on personal property.

Public Pickleball Facilities (see Exhibit 2):

- 1. City Facilities
 - a. 1 permanent dedicated court at Johnny D Wallis Park; however, there is no fencing, so balls fly off the court and it's not idea for play unless you are at a pro level or a small child. No lighting is provided for evening play so usage by working-class is limited to summer months or weekends. The court is shared with children's basketball hoop game creating safety concerns. These issues result in low usage by the community and in this current condition this court should not be considered a fully functional pickleball court included in the inventory.
 - b. 2 courts at Evergreen; however, nets are not provided so players must purchase and provide their own nets; therefore, this impacts families/players with limited financial means. Usage limited only to community that have means to afford their own nets. No lighting is provided for evening play so usage by the working-class is limited to summer months or weekends. The park services a neighborhood segment rather than the city at large based on

- location. Additionally, this is NOT a dedicated pickleball court. The City merely striped an existing tennis court to accommodate pickleball play; therefore, it reduces tennis court inventory and creates conflicts for competing resources between the pickleball and tennis community (additional lines also creates game confusion during play).
- c. 5 courts at GVCC. All courts are temporary and 1 court is multiuse. Temporary courts were repurposed from abandoned tennis facility, striping on multipurpose court creates game confusion during play. This is currently the best and highest used facility in Goleta, even though it is temporary. A request is proposed to recategorize the courts from tennis to dedicated pickleball. Nets and lighting are provided creating a more inclusive equitable environment that is easily accessible for those with lower income means. Courts have proper fencing, stripping and it's the only City courts with lighting to support evening play. Location is desirable and brings business into Old Town, bathroom provided, accessible parking, 4 courts are a pickleball only, 1 court is multi-use, court reservation system and open play systems provide good access, suitable for tournaments. Courts require resurfacing along with permanent pickleball nets and other minor improvements for safer better play (see repairs needed below).

2. County Facilities

- a. Although not within the city limits of Goleta there are 4 courts operated by Santa Barbara County at Kellogg, just outside the City of Goleta. Courts are newly built in 2021 so surface, nets, etc. are new. Certain design element flaws, location, parking and no lighting make it less desirable to the community than the GVCC location even though the GVCC site is older and requires upgrading.
- Public Schools
 - a. No facilities exist, unlike tennis and basketball which is available at San Marcos and Dos Pueblos schools and UCSB

GVCC Court Facility (see pictures Exhibit 2)

12 months ago: The GVCC courts were available to the public as 1 tennis court and a basketball court asset; however, this asset had not been used in nearly 15 years. It was essentially abandoned and rarely used by anyone for basketball, tennis or any other usage. The facility was in high need of repair and it was the Goleta-based pickleball community (desperate for community resources) that provided the improvements and made an investment in these courts to support pickleball.

Current: The facility has become a vibrant active park used on a daily basis and widely supported by hundreds of pickleball players. GVCC pickleball has become a center for community bringing hundreds of individuals into Old Town patronizing restaurants, gas stations, markets and other businesses. The pickleball community using their personal time, resources and funding worked in collaboration with GVCC staff to restore this public asset so everyone in the community could benefit. As of this date there have been no public funds or resources used to support this effort. This has been a highly successful grass roots community action program that is now available for the benefit of everyone in the community. The public restored and salvaged this area with surface improvements, court stripping, purchased nets, replaced and installed new fencing, installed wind screening materials, repaired lights and upgraded the lighting to an energy efficient LED system. (additional information provided under diversity discussion)

The area consisted of 1 tennis court and 1 multiuse basketball court. The tennis court area was transformed from 1 tennis court into 4 pickleball courts and the multiuse area additionally accommodates 1 added pickleball court striped for both pickleball and basketball available for either sport. The basketball facility is highly dated by any measures with old metal backboards, so the public prefers to play basketball on more updated equipment that is provided at other area parks and schools. The pickleball community additionally provided a facelift to this basketball area including paint and new nets in the event that someone may choose to use it.

Court time and security: Courts are secured, and access is permitted only through locked gates. The GVCC staff unlocks gates at 8:00 am and locks the gates promptly at 8:30 pm, the lights are on a timer that automatically turns off at 8:35 pm. Public is unable to access courts outside these times.

Court Usage: Courts are available on both an open play system and a reservation system. A website was designed to allow community access to make reservations for courts to assist in managing the high demand and also allows for the public to know when open play is available or when a court is available. Prior to the website players would randomly drive around town hoping to find an open court. GVCC staff collaborated with the community and through trial and error identified the best operational access, hours and usage. The current system in place has been working well for all stakeholders. Open play concept allows the community to socially interact through a system designed such that an individual player or group of players could collaborate together using the courts in conjunction with other individuals and groups. This unique play fosters diversity, community and many social aspects of the sport. An individual arrives at the court and places a paddle into a rack along with other player's paddles then four paddles are combined in this system grouping players to a court. Each group plays one game, leaves the court allowing another group to play and continues the rotation. Players introduce themselves and make new friends while on the court as well as waiting for the next court. This continues throughout the period and someone who is new to the game can play 6-8 games and meet 20 new people over a 2-hour period. Observation shows the players share contact information and develop relationships simply by meeting at the courts for pickleball. The reservation system allows for groups of people to reserve and share the courts with their select family or

friends and controls so one group does not dominate the time and discriminate against others. Open play generally is the highest court usage, the most activity and the most visitors to GVCC at any given time. The described court system has been able to regulate the usage to controlled hours and days for open play vs reservation play. This system has proved highly effective allowing the ability to measure and control usage, activity and resulting noise generated to specific times of play.

Court Fees: The current operating bylaws of GVCC require that all services provided by GVCC to the community have small fees associated to offset administrative and maintenance fees to operate facility. Many municipalities charge a fee for tennis and pickleball due to the cost to maintain the courts for example Santa Barbara charges a \$5 fee and Lompoc charges a \$3 fee to use their facilities. After conducting a review of other fees and keeping in line with GVCC policy for fees to be below market for other municipalities GVCC determined a reasonable and nominal usage fee would be \$2 for drop in or \$60 for unlimited annual usage (appx \$0.16/day). The daily use fee uses an honor system with a fee drop box or ability to pay online. So far these fees do not appear to create a barrier or discriminate players (additional information under diversity discussion below). The fees provide an offset to administrative costs, court maintenance and portable restrooms. Popularity has generated over \$18,000 of *incremental* revenue annually to GVCC along with exposure to Old Town and Community Center resources now used by hundreds of new families. Some municipalities have even promoted their pickleball courts creating grant programs for the facilities and providing loaner paddles. These ideas have been widely discussed within the Goleta pickleball community and supported by the local chapters of the USA Pickleball Association; however, they have yet to be adopted by the City and with the lack of public funding the private donations and fund raisers have been necessary to simply provide the site as a community resource and cover the improvements.

Alternative Options/sites for City Provided Pickleball (details in Exhibit 2):

Alternatives sites to GVCC include either converting existing tennis courts, identifying a park with enough land to construct new court facilities, or completing a land acquisition to build a new pickleball facility.

Converting existing tennis courts. This is a lower cost option than new construction; however, it results in a loss of tennis resources or a conflict and competing interest between pickleball and tennis players. There are only 3 existing tennis facilities available within the 28 City parks (Berkley, Stowe or Evergreen). Even though converting these courts reduces tennis facilities, tennis is still available at the high schools and university and the Goleta master plan indicates a surplus of courts not including the highs school and university resources. For reasons stated, a complete conversion and reclassification of a facility from tennis to pickleball would have the best results. Of the 3 courts mentioned Evergreen would be the best option for conversion, based on size it is likely to convert these 2 tennis courts into 5-6 pickleball courts. The other two location are in closer proximity to residential areas which may present a different set of challenges. Converting existing tennis courts would in most cases require resurfacing and restriping to accommodate pickleball, so the cost is basically the same whether completed at GVCC or another location (see options table in Exhibit 2). Resurfacing GVCC and reclassifying it at as a permeant dedicated pickleball court facility would add additional resources and is identified as the best option and location at this time for pickleball for reasons indicated within this report.

Construction of new courts for pickleball. Parks require enough acreage for court construction and should be positioned at a distance from residential areas. Aside from costs for construction, alternative sites would require permitting, environmental impacts etc. taking months, meanwhile the community would not have pickleball resources. Based on the increasing demand and the numerous benefits of this sport, the City should examine additional sites within existing parks as well as a land acquisition to build a dedicated pickleball facility in addition to retaining existing pickleball resources and reclassifying the GVCC court as a dedicated for pickleball facility. The reclassification of GVCC appears to meet immediate demand while additional resources are pursued.

GVCC an Ideal Location and Facility for Pickleball

Resources: Compatible with master plan and logical reallocation of unused resources into active facility with a proven program.

Location: Consistent with the sport of pickleball this location, in the heart of Goleta fosters Community and Diversity.

Proximity: Easily accessible by all Goleta residents with ample parking that does not interfere with others.

Lighting: This is the only facility that allow for evening court activities to accommodate work-force citizens.

Promotes business: Old Town has already experienced the benefits of hundreds of players.

Essence of Community: the social and community aspects of pickleball align with the goals of a community center.

Community Supported: The community supports this location and has personally invested in this facility.

Noise considerations: The area is properly zoned to accommodate these activities; a history of other active recreation exists. The area is mostly zoned commercial and industrial uses (see noise discussion for further information).

Minimal Investment: Pickleball requires a tennis court type facility including court surface, high fencing, painted lines, nets separation between courts etc. all currently present at GVCC. The lowest cost option for upgrading, meeting other municipalities. **Business and neighboring support**: GVCC pickleball is supported by the immediate neighboring organizations: Willow Creek Condo Association, United Boy's and Girls Club of Goleta, CommUnify, Rainbow School, Special Olympics, Numerous local business owners within Old Town including Hampton Inn, McDonalds Restaurants, Habit Restaurant, Goleta Coffee, Yogurtland, Jane's and many more including some of the larger Goleta employers and employees (Apeel, True Digital Surgery, Cottage Hospital, UCSB facility).

Additional Court Repairs and Improvements Needed at GVCC

The community takes pride and care of this facility and even during the holidays the courts are decorated with a welcoming community spirit to all players. Although the community has made a significant investment and has spent endless hours working on the courts, they still require additional help that is currently beyond the means of the community itself.

After reviewing all the tennis court facilities, it is concluded that any tennis court to pickleball court use conversion within the existing Goleta parks system will require some repairs or improvements to accommodate pickleball. The conversion from tennis courts at GVCC is considerably the easiest and least expensive option. The resources and improvements made by the community provide an idea foundation for the City to build upon and with minimum effort these courts could become a valued asset offering services comparable to other local municipalities. (refer to Exhibit 2 and below)









These pictures show some of the needed repairs. Court resurfacing and restriping to bring up to standards with other area cities and that of the City of Goleta (see Exhibit 2 for comparison pics). Portable temporary nets replaced with permanent nets. Portable nets could be repurposed and used at Evergreen or other area. Fencing repair along with landscaping, leveling and better access to entry of courts. Attached is an estimate for repairs needed to bring the courts into an acceptable condition like other area municipal resources. Exhibit 2 shows the improvements needed at each possible tennis conversion site and because of the community efforts already completed, GVCC represents the facility with lowest cost and least immediate requirements.







Covered Seating, Benches Landscaping

Due to the use of the pickleball facilities, GVCC may have considerably more visitors daily than any other parks; however, additional funding and upgrades are needed to support and reflect the desires within the Goleta Parks and Playgrounds Master Plan.

Picnic areas are needed for GVCC to meet community needs and to be compatible with other area parks. Shading and seating for those waiting for courts is desirable and standard for municipal tennis facilities including Evergreen, Berkley and other cities (Exhibit 2). Both needs can be easily addressed as seen at Johnny Wallace Park (pic to right). Many communities additionally incorporate games such as corn hole to play while waiting for courts increasing social and community interactions.



Noise impacts Associated with Increasing Recreational Activities in Parks (additional information Exhibits 3-4)

The primary request presented is to convert existing tennis courts into permanent/dedicated pickleball courts. As indicated the tennis courts at this facility have not been used for numerous years. Tennis players have chosen to use tennis facilities at other city parks leaving the GVCC facility as a significantly under-utilized asset until it was converted to pickleball. The courts were built for active tennis use and studies have shown that noise/sound levels for tennis are comparable to pickleball.

Noise at the GVCC facility may be more of a perception than an issue. The GVCC facility has from gone from virtually no use at all to active vibrant daily use which is aligned with the goals for the Community Center and Goleta Parks and Recreation. As activity increases, we would expect additional noise since the facility has essentially been dormant for more than 15 years.

When evaluating issues associated with noise it is important to review the Goleta General Land Use Plan which provides guidelines for acceptable standards, and it also provides actual ambient noise samples taken from various Goleta sites including GVCC.

The additional noise generated from increased pickleball activity in the park does not appear to be a significant impact on the local community:

- 1. Location, noise and Land Use Compatibility/zoning Acceptable Noise levels and existing noise environment (Exhibit 3)
 - a. GVCC is located in an area that is predominantly zoned for business and industrial uses with a few residential areas located more than 200 feet from the center. The area is affected by many sources of noise, including automobile and freeway noise, railway traffic, airport and aircraft operations (it sets in a flight path), industrial and commercial activity (including speaker systems from car dealers, outdoor movie theaters and flea market activity), and periodic nuisances such as construction noise, amplified sound, loud parties, and other events.
 - b. Per the Goleta General Plan, field noise measurements at the community center normally measures 62.3 dBA, and the old town residency areas measure 60.7 dBA.
 - c. Normal acceptable noise levels for a Goleta playground or park are established by the general plan and has been set between 50-70 dBA.
 - d. Unofficial measurements taken from outside the residential areas nearest GVCC during the most active pickleball play times had maximum readings between 50-63 dBA. Levels would be significantly reduced from inside properties and furthermore, levels would be very minimal when windows are closed. Measurements directly on the GVCC courts during full active play had maximum levels between 60-70 dBA within the standards set for parks and playgrounds.

2. Shared responsibilities

- a. Based on items indicated above, a certain level of responsibility rests with owners, residents and developers of properties to share in a responsibility of providing noise insulation measure so that newly constructed as well as existing properties comply with building standards for allowable interior noise levels. The policies are established to improve soundproofing for both noise receivers and sources. Property owners and developers are required to provide noise insulation measures to reduce interior noise levels to acceptable levels this includes insulation, glazing, double pane windows, etc.
- b. Title 25, Section 1092 of the California Code of Regulations along with Goleta New Zoning Ordinances indicate that locating units in areas where exterior ambient noise levels may exceed 65 dBA require the developer to incorporate into building design construction features that will reduce interior noise levels to 45 dBA. Property owners have a responsibility to meet building standards for interior sound at these levels. Additionally, the Winslow and Willow Creek projects received zoning changes to accommodate residential housing that was not originally anticipated for these locations.
- 3. Exhibit 4 provides a table is showing the sound levels of various activities for relevant and comparative purposes.
- 4. The number of noise complaints has been minimal, it is not an excessive number and GVCC has implemented policies limiting usage which reduces overall noise. GVCC staff has proactively solicited neighbors for feedback. Only a very few individuals have expressed concerns regarding noise; however, at the same time other neighbors in the same complexes have indicated there is no issue.
 - a. The association representing 37 homeowners within Willow Creek, one of the closest residential communities issued a supportive letter indicating there is no issues pertaining to noise.
 - b. Letters received from the Winslow Community are also supportive and indicate that they barely hear any noise. Also public speakers at the Nov 18th Parks and Rec meeting indicated that noise was not a factor at Winslow.
 - c. The GVCC facility had not been used in years and now has regular active use, so a certain level of complaints is expected due to the changes and increases in activity.
- 5. In an effort to evaluate concerns and ensure notification to neighboring tenants and residents, staff went above and beyond the City of Goleta's required noticing procedures and even mailed notices on November 4, 2021 to over 500 residents/tenants within a 300-foot boundary from the parcel edges of the Goleta Community Center. This noticing was in addition to the press release, website news posting, GovDelivery email notification system, direct emails to interested

parties previously requesting notification, a story on this topic in the Monarch Press and posting to all City of Goleta social media platforms.

- a. With all that effort only 3 individuals expressed a concern regarding increased noise levels. These letters contain many exaggerated claims, including race and times of play, that cannot be substantiated or supported.
- 6. Consistency among area parks. Determining factors regarding noise at GVCC may also have unintentional impacts at other parks that have residential communities within a similar proximity as GVCC and possibly closer. Most of the existing 28 parks do have residential areas in closer proximity. As the City meets its need to provide increased activity within the parks system for a healthier community the result will be increased noise from the increased activity as we have seen at GVCC and Johnny D. Wallace parks. Johnny D. Wallace Park is directly next to residential homes and less than 100 feet from other residences. As an active park with pickleball, basketball, bocce ball, handball, ping pong, a skateboard plaza and soon a splash pad, the increased activities create increased noise factors that certain residents may find annoying. There is a high likelihood that an individual may relocate to the area and find noise from any one of these activities, such as skateboarding or basketball annoying and considerate it excessive even though it meets the operating standards for parks. The City will need to treat all parks with the same standards and expect that increased activity will increased noise. They will need to determine if any noise is actually held at a daily constant elevated level that disrupts activities and cannot be reduced through property upgrades or possibly a mere annoyance to a small number and not impacting the majority. Current zoning policy gives city officials a degree of flexibility in cases having a substantial benefit to the City.

The human perception of sound loudness is subjective and some individuals may be annoyed by sounds that don't annoy another. When considering evaluated noise one must identify whether the level is continually disruptive to activities or is it a mere annoyance, is the noise affecting a majority of stakeholders, can the noise be eliminated by closing windows and/or mitigation factors within the residence itself. If noise receptors have exhausted available means to reduce noise, then the noise source would implement additional means to further provide a reduction. The collaborative effort should result in maintaining acceptable levels per published standards.

GVCC has been proactive to mitigate or control noise levels

GVCC desires to retain a collaborative environment between all stakeholders including residents, businesses and those utilizing the facility. Most Goleta parks are non-staffed open facilities; however, the GVCC site does have regular onsite staff that helps with maintenance and monitors activities conducted at the center. Having staff present allows GVCC to evaluate situations to maintain harmony with the community.

GVCC has given thoughtful consideration regarding noise elements and has been proactive in implementing the following policies for the use of pickleball activities on the courts:

- 1. Operational hours are limited between 8:00 am and 8:30 pm enforced with locked gates and timers on lights. These hours are in alignment with other communities and needed allowing the working-class citizens ease and use of the facility.
 - a. All gates are locked by GVCC staff and there is no knowledge of court use outside posted hours. Such use would require scaling a 12' fenced area to access the courts, possibly in darkness.
 - b. Lights are on a timer system and automatically turn off at 8:35 pm. There is no other lighting, rendering the courts in complete darkness during the 6-month period when sunset is between 5-6:30pm.
- 2. Signage has been installed asking users to be respectful of area neighbors and noise.
- 3. The GVCC site is the only pickleball site in Goleta that controls open play and regulates this using a reservation website.
 - a. Open play hours will typically provide the highest usage of the facility and when there are a larger number of players noise levels naturally increase.
 - b. GVCC has regulated this usage to controlled hours and days for open play limiting to only two evenings a week and only mornings on the weekends. Non-open play is scheduled via the reservation website and is available all other times and typically there are less players and thus less noise all week-long during work hours and 5 out of 7 evenings a week. Through trial and error GVCC found these hours to represent a minimum for open play and public access, initially public demand desired more open play and longer access hours.
 - c. These control measures have been highly effective containing the higher active hours to a very minimum.
- 4. Notices are posted to the GVCC pickleball website and reminders are proactively emailed to users to promote and foster a respectful community environment. Based on public responses we appear to be successfully meeting this initiative.
- 5. GVCC continues to monitor the situation and has researched additional sound barriers and materials that may further reduce sound factors if the need arises. It is our goal to grow an active community center while balancing that growth and considering factors such as sound which is an unavoidable aspect of any built environment.

Discussion of Diversity - Will the City of Goleta make resources available to the Community

There's nothing about race, ethnicity, gender, age, social economic status, etc. that deters or prevents people from playing pickleball – it's the location of courts and the available resources provided by cities. Ironically, it is not the people or the sport that will be the cause for exclusivity, but rather, court location and accessibility will be the primary and possibly the only factors that limit diversity or create exclusivity within the sport. The City of Goleta shall determine if the sport of pickleball becomes inclusive or exclusive within our own community. The decisions to support this activity, the locations of the courts and the ongoing funding for the growth will be the deciding factors. Without the support of the City, the only local resources available to pickleball players will be expensive private clubs, so the choices made by the City itself determines the diversity and availability of this sport to the working class citizens and those less fortunate living in Goleta. Currently, the only resources classified for pickleball by the City are Evergreen and Johnny D Wallace Park, and the location, court design and financial requirements to play at these parks all impact and hinder the diversity, equity and inclusive aspects naturally occurring with pickleball play.

Due to its unique aspects pickleball itself fosters diversity and inclusiveness more than most other sports. Exclusiveness is generally created when courts are built in areas away from need-based areas or when cities do not provide pickleball courts at all leaving private clubs as the only options. Pickleball as a sport has no limitation pertaining to diversity and is one of the most prominent and diverse activities that promotes a diverse, inclusive, healthy, and active community. What makes this diversity unique is you will find that everyone is playing with everyone else in an open-ended round-robin format. No other sport has this spirit of interaction across the normal barriers of society. The name Pickleball itself was chosen to emphasize the centrality of this inclusiveness. In rowing, a pickle boat crew is composed of leftover oarsmen from other boats and is often comprised of coed teams, something that is not usual in rowing. The name was chosen to emphasize its coed and inclusive nature.

As reflected in the 2018 physical council activity report (Exhibit 6) the affluent are getting more active while the less affluent are becoming more inactive. Approximately 42% of the population earning less than \$25,000/year are inactive and 34% of the population earning between \$25-50,000/year are inactive as compared to only 18% of the population earning over \$100,000 are inactive. Locating pickleball at the GVCC site by restoring/repurposing a 20-year-old abandoned tennis court removes inequity barriers and promotes a healthy community providing access to one of the most active and fast-growing sports. The social aspects inherent in pickleball need to be highlighted as shown to be a key catalyst to engaging the inactive community (Exhibit 6). The social and health benefits associated with pickleball where prominently represented from the hundreds of letters received from public comments. This reinforces that this the social aspects are highly engaging within the population of Goleta. (Exhibit 8)

From a cost standpoint pickleball is less expensive than the cost to play or purchase equipment for most other sports including: bicycling, roller skating, skateboarding, basketball, baseball, soccer, weightlifting, volleyball, tennis and is comparable to the cost of a yoga pad. According to data within the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan, Goleta residents spent on average \$1,221 a year on personal recreational expenditures. The cost of a pickleball paddle is only 2% of this expenditure and provides hours of ongoing healthy activity. Some municipalities have promoted their pickleball courts with grant programs for the facilities and providing loaner paddles. These ideas have been widely discussed within the Goleta pickleball community and supported by the local chapters of the USA Pickleball Association; however, they have yet to be adopted by the City and with the lack of public funding the private donations and fund raisers have been necessary to simply provide the site as a community resource.

It's ease of entry, though, is not its most remarkable trait. Pickleball is an unusually inclusive sport, relative to most other sports it is unique. A wide range of age groups, body types, athletic ability levels, races, genders, socioeconomic status and ethnic or social groups can be found playing at the GVCC pickle ball courts – everyone is welcome. The Goleta pickleball players work to advance diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility all aspects naturally occurring with this unique sport (refer to pickleball attributes presented above). Pickleball at GVCC has become a unique activity and environment whereby everyone attending has been welcomed and has built community and new friendships. This is easily documented through the comments made within the hundreds of letters received and the public comments made at previous meetings. As the popularity spreads among Goleta one would expect the demographic trend of players to follow the overall demographics for the entire City (Exhibit 5). Roughly 33.2% of the overall population is older than age 50 which has been a primary demographic for pickleball; however, due to the social aspects and family dynamics we are experiencing significant players within the 25-50 age range which constitutes another 32.8% of the Goleta population. Within these brackets pickleball at GVCC is providing valuable health aspects, daily, to approximately two-thirds of the Goleta population and input received from the community indicates that children are additionally being exposed and enjoying the sport with their parents and grandparents.

Pickleball has help make GVCC an epicenter for the absolute definition of community. The players coming to GVCC select that site because of its location and meaning within the Goleta Community. These individuals are not leaving exclusive country clubs to play pickleball at GVCC. Quite the opposite, they are the working-class of Goleta, the backbone of our community (teachers, emergency response personnel, nurses, landscapers, carpenters, plumbers, electricians, small business persons, etc.) and many reside in Old Town.

These individuals have used their personal savings and resources to restore this public asset and build community – all during a difficult covid environment without any government or public support. They have taken things as far as they can and now are asking the City to help support this highly desired activity within the community.

The GVCC facility represents the greatest opportunity to provide pickleball to the most diverse individuals of our community. It is in the heart of Goleta and within proximity to the most diverse population. It provides the greatest ease of access via bicycle, pedestrian, public transportation, and least driven miles providing ample parking as well. Although not included within this report, the GVCC location has undoubtedly had a very positive environmental and climate impact. It is well known that hundreds of users living in Goleta were daily, actively driving significant miles to access the only public courts available near Montecito. The GVCC location provided a higher sustainability best practice framework and removed barriers allowing easier access to health promoting activities for the underserved population within Goleta reducing the need to drive miles to find a court.

If the facility is not supported with dedicated courts, it will literally deprive hundreds of families from this social experience or force them to drive to other community, which in turn generates other environmental issues. The GVCC site and local businesses have already benefited from the pickleball usage which is currently categorized as "temporary" and we now seek to change that to "permanent/dedicated" pickleball usage. That simple change shall retain this unique resource within the heart of Old Town Goleta.

If the City of Goleta does not to provide community resources for pickleball, by these actions it is the City and City officials actively deciding to remove resources and limit this sport within the community to only those individuals who have the resources to join private clubs or build personal courts within private residents. Additionally, those actions will further be in direct conflict the City's own Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan.

Thus far it has been the working-class citizens within our community who have raised funds and promoted this unique game to everyone. You have received hundreds of letters of how it has made a difference in the lives of people within our community and these letters come from people from ALL ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds.

As a community the pickleball players at GVCC have demonstrated that they are extremely inclusive, open, environmentally conscious. They have embraced sharing courts with Boys and Girls Club children, even holding clinics and playing alongside them. The players at GVCC have provided the use of free paddles, balls etc. so anyone in the community can participate. They have expressed a desire to work collaboratively with the City to support pickleball within the community and their actions have demonstrated this collaborative efforts to GVCC. We rarely see this sense of community and support from other activities within the parks and it is one that should be acknowledged, embraced, supported and fostered by the City of Goleta as well.

- 1. These are not privileged citizens who left their fancy expensive private clubs to play pickleball at GVCC.
- 2. These are working class citizens of all ethnicities, ages and socioeconomic status who did not have personal resources to join exclusive clubs or build personal courts on their private property. Many of these citizens are renters who rely on community resources to support healthy active after work activities.
- 3. These are citizens who rescued a declining, dilapidated and basically abandoned resource. These citizens removed debris weeds etc. to help revive and save the courts before they were totally lost.
- 4. These are citizens who used their own personally resources to refurbish and restore new life into the abandoned GVCC tennis courts.
- 5. These are citizens who had to use house paint to cover courts making them acceptable to play.
- 6. These are citizens who bought bottles of spray paint from local hardware stores and hand painted lines on the court.
- 7. These are citizens who scoured to find portable pickleball nets because the type of permanent nets supplied by other cities (Santa Barbara, Solvang, Santa Maria, San Luis Obispo, etc) are not provided here in Goleta.
- 8. These are environmentally concerned citizens who brought their own ladders to hang wind screening that was salvaged from other local courts and who saved that screening from filling our landfill for hundreds of years.
- 9. These are citizens who used their own funds to repair lighting at the courts because the City did not provide healthy active sports facilities for the working-class citizen who spend all day working and can only exercise in the evenings.
- 10. These are citizens who are environmentally conscious and went beyond repairing the lights and replaced the City's expensive energy wasting lighting system with an updated/upgraded LED system that improves the carbon footprint, reduces light pollution, saves energy and reduces costs.
- 11. These are citizens who support other citizens and local businesses using their network and supported local electricians and local workers rather than hiring out of town companies to assist with repairs and improvements.

These are citizens who worked together to embrace and bring this valuable asset to the city welcoming all players without any limitations or restrictions on those who use the facilities. These are the people of Goleta and the City Officials should be honored to represent and support them.

Meeting Future Pickleball Needs

It is expected and identified in the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan that the desire and usage for pickleball will increase. The City should begin the reviewing and planning process to identify additional resources to meet demand and consider locations for a dedicated pickleball complex. In the meantime, given that the community made a significant investment into the courts at GVCC and has embraced the location is a clear indication that pickleball is the highest and best use for the courts at the GVCC location, at least until additional resources are added by the City. Furthermore, the City should itself make an reciprocal investment to make the requested improvements and support the community efforts that have already been implemented.

Conclusions

Given the enormous growth and positive support for pickleball at GVCC it simply makes good common sense and good governance to reclassify the GVCC courts from a tennis service to a permanent dedicated pickleball resource. Further it makes sense to make a minimal investment to assist in bringing the facility up to date with other comparable facilities provided by area cities. Approximately 135 citizens attended the zoom session. Over 400 positive and supportive letters along with 13 public comments containing amazing stories supporting a permanent/dedicated pickleball facility at GVCC, improving the facilities at GVCC and considering expanding those facilities in the future.

At any time in the future this resource can again be reclassified for another use that may make sense at that time. When initially developed there existed a need for tennis now the needs have changed and if we desire that the community use our resources (rather than sit idle/abandoned) then resources need to be adjusted based on the community input. As the City continues growing its pickleball resources it may in the future "retire" these courts for another activity or it may decide GVCC represents the best location for expansion of pickleball and then these courts will provide a good strong base to build upon.

Although in need of improvement and not meeting standards of other municipalities, the pickleball courts at GVCC are the City's best pickleball asset/resource currently. The temporary courts at GVCC represents the largest number of pickleball courts within the City and is by far the highest used facility. The other locations have issues and are not being fully used or accepted by the community. Therefore, without this reclassification, Goleta essentially does not provide any resources and the community would perceive this as a removal of this valuable and highly desirable resource.

There is an overwhelming number of logical reasons to support the reclassification of the GVCC courts to dedicated pickleball.

- 1. There is a deficient/shortage of pickleball courts within the Goleta City parks and recreation resources and given the growth of the sport this deficiency is expected to increase.
- 2. The Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan indicates that there is a surplus for tennis resources. Observations indicate that the current courts are not consistently busy (unlike the pickleball courts). Tennis courts are widely available at the local high schools. Reclassification does not impact the resource inventory being used.
- 3. The reclassification is necessary based on changes in community needs. The GVCC tennis court was abandoned and unused for over 15 years, now it is used on a regular basis.
- 4. The proposal to the City of Goleta creates an opportunity to convert 1 tennis court into 4 pickleball courts and additionally dedicate 1 more pickleball court for a total of 5 courts and retain the 5th court as a multiuse court.
- 5. It is clear the City of Goleta will need to add more pickleball resources in addition to the 5 courts at GVCC and if GVCC courts are not reclassified that significantly increases the deficit in resources.
- 6. Locating pickleball courts at GVCC was initiated by the community and accepted by hundreds of families. It is currently the most widely used park resource than any other park within the City of Goleta. It is a location and sport supported predominantly by the working-class residents of our community who are frequently neglected.
- 7. The GVCC location meets or exceeds all criteria for planning for GVCC, the Goleta Parks and Playground Master Plan, Goleta Revitalization Plan, the Goleta Sustainability Best Practices Framework and even The National Physical Activity Council.
- 8. Currently, GVCC represents the most economic and efficient use of space for pickleball resources. A minimal investment will bring GVCC pickleball court resources up to levels of other municipalities and GVCC facility offers 5 pickleball resources (only replaces 1 tennis resources) due to the nature of the game provides activity to hundreds of families on a daily basis.
- 9. GVCC pickleball has proven to attract community to Old Town increasing business activity and activity within GVCC.
- 10. The GVCC location presents the highest and best pickleball resource within Goleta: centrally located, ease and accessibility via pedestrian, biking, public transportation with ample parking, lighting, bathrooms, court separation, reservation website, fencing, gated access monitored and this location all currently in place so is economically feasible and the location is aligned with the mission of GVCC to foster community activities and provide equitable inclusive resources to the Goleta community.

The information overwhelming supports a clear choice at this time to utilize the GVCC site and begin the process by reclassifying this resource as permanent dedicated pickleball courts and then approve the necessary improvements so Goleta can begin to match or exceed the resources of other area cities. Further, the city should continue exploring locations for a pickleball complex that can meet current and future demand while promoting the community and social aspects of this sport.

Exhibit 1 - Park Resources - A Shortage of Pickleball Facilities

Community Center Plan

The City should continue to maintain the current community center, and associated buildings, as a focal point for community activities and functions, including senior services, youth services, and various related classes and cultural and recreational activities. Tennis Resources: There is a surplus of tennis facilities to service the city (Table 3-2 and 3-3). Additionally, the tennis community abandoned the courts at GVCC, and they have not been used by that community on over 15 years.

Pickleball Resources: The Goleta Master plan identified that there was a shortage of available pickleball courts based on Goleta population (Table 3-2 and 3-3). These estimates were made before the popularity of the sport really expanded throughout the community.

Reclassification of GVCC Tennis courts to Permanent Dedicated Pickleball Courts: Based on the resources this is a logical conclusion as it does not impact the tennis community, yet it provides much needed resources to the Pickleball community. The GVCC Pickleball courts are currently used by hundreds of families, even with this resource there is likely a need for additional courts throughout the City.

Exhibit 2 - Goleta Services Compared to other Municipal Pickleball Courts on Central Coast

This exhibit focuses on pickleball resources provided by municipalities and provides a comparison between those within the city of Goleta and other municipalities. There are numerous private facilities; however, the high costs and membership fees and application processes make these resources rather exclusive. The following is focused on pickleball facilities and not tennis. Most municipalities have significant tennis resources and additional resources are publicly available at many public schools. Municipalities are actively attempting to catch up to the demand for pickleball and in many cases are behind in providing resources.

Goleta

Goleta is clearly trailing behind other municipalities in supporting pickleball courts. The current resources provided by the City of Goleta at this time are considerably inferior in comparison to other area cities. GVCC offers the best resource and has the foundation to be a strong resource with a small investment. The community made a significant investment and should the City decide to make these courts permanent dedicated pickleball and provide some additional improvements the City could begin to catchup its pickleball resources and be more in alignment/equivalent with other cities.

GVCC: Older facility requiring updating. Needs resurfacing with proper court coloring, permanent nets, fencing repair, landscaping and entry updates, benches, shade covering. Community and private funding made significant improvements to date. Current features: Court separation, lighting, bathrooms, ample parking, reservation website, fencing, gated access monitored and controlled.

Additional Resources and Future Consideration

To continue to meet the increasing demand for pickleball and other activities that build healthy communities, The Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan has identified several locations to expand facilities within the existing park system, using public schools and additional land acquisitions. High value may be obtained by the City of Goleta to pursue discussions and planning. Many cities have sports complexes and where applicable are adding and utilizing the social and health aspects associated with pickleball to be a driving force for these complexes.

These opportunities require a much longer planning timeline and, in the meantime, GVCC currently represents the best opportunity to delivering pickleball resources to the community. Should future complexes be developed the City could revisit the usage at GVCC making adjustments as needs change. As Identified the 26 acres at Dos Pueblos High and the 11.6 acres (currently West Wind Drive in) represent excellent opportunities for expanding pickleball and other resources.

Dos Pueblos High School (26 acres) has significant acreage and many foundational services in which the city and the high school could both benefit from a joint use agreement. There is also potential to expand alongside the existing tennis courts which is an economical option and introducing students to pickleball has significant benefits for both the school and the City. The location is remote yet close to shopping, restaurants, and hotels which would accommodate tournament play that provides significant revenue for the City. Additionally, it is accessible by bike routes and public transportation with ample parking. It also is in close proximity to Los Carneros area which has been designated as "park poor" due to rapid residential growth of apartments, workforce housing and low-income dwellings.







West Wind Drive-in (11.6 acres) and two sites near Los Carneros (15.3 and 11.8 acres) were additional potential locations; however, these require an acquisition or developer negotiations.

Sensitive Noise Receptors

Sensitive noise receptors are defined as users or types of uses that are interrupted (rather than merely annoyed) by relatively low levels of noise. Such receptors include residential neighborhoods, schools, libraries, hospitals and rest homes, auditoriums, certain open space areas, and public assembly places. Sensitive noise receptor monitoring locations are included in Figures 9-1 and 9-2. This map does not denote all residential areas, so it should be used in combination with land use maps that comprehensively show all residential areas. Sound levels were measured at each of the numbered sites on October 13 to 15, 2003. Results of this sound monitoring are included in Table 9-1.

Goleta Noise Sources and Existing Noise Environment

Goleta is affected by several different sources of noise, including automobile and railway traffic, airport and aircraft operations, industrial and commercial activity, and periodic nuisances such as construction noise, amplified sound, loud parties, and other events. Roadway Traffic Noise: In general, noise levels caused by highway traffic are directly correlated with the volumes and speeds of vehicles and with increases in the number of large truck vehicles. Noise levels adjacent to U.S. Highway 101 (US-101) range from 75 to 90 dBA CNEL, while noise levels adjacent to major arterials in the city can be as high as 85 dBA CNEL. The orientation and spacing of these major roadways combined with the proximity of the Santa Barbara Airport result in a large part of the city being subject to existing noise levels that exceed 60 dBA CNEL, as shown on Figures 9-1 and 9-2.

9.3 CITY POLICIES Policy NE 1: Noise and Land Use Compatibility Standards [GP] Objectives: To protect Goleta's residents, workers, and visitors from excessive noise by applying noise standards in land use decisions. To ensure compatibility of land uses with noise exposure levels, and to neither introduce new development in areas with unacceptable noise levels nor allow new noise sources that would impact existing development.

NE 1.1 Land Use Compatibility Standards. [GP] The City shall use the standards and criteria of Table 9-2 to establish compatibility of land use and noise exposure. The City shall require appropriate mitigation, if feasible, or prohibit development that would subject

proposed or existing land uses to noise levels that exceed acceptable levels as indicated in this table. Proposals for new development that would cause standards to be exceeded shall only be approved if the project would provide a substantial benefit to the City (including but not limited to provision of affordable housing units or as part of a redevelopment project), and if adequate mitigation measures are employed to reduce interior noise levels to acceptable levels.

Acceptable Noise Levels. [GP] New construction and substantial alterations of existing construction shall include appropriate noise insulation measures (such as insulation, glazing, and other sound attenuation measures) so that such construction or renovations comply with state and building code standards for allowable interior noise levels. The intent of this policy is to require improved soundproofing for both noise receivers and sources.

Definition and Measurement of Noise

Noise is an unavoidable aspect of any built environment. Noise is defined as a sound or series of sounds that are perceived as irritating, objectionable, and/or disruptive to the quality of daily life. Levels of noise are measured in decibels (dB) and are typically expressed as A-weighted decibels (dBA). The A-weighted decibel scale adjusts for very high and very low sound frequencies that are inaudible to humans. Noise levels emitted by various sources are often expressed as equivalent energy level (Leq). Because sound levels at a particular location typically vary over the course of the day and because people tend to be more sensitive to noise in the evening and at night than during the morning and afternoon, sound levels are commonly averaged over a 24-hour period, weighted for night and evening sensitivity, and expressed as either Day-Night Noise Level (Ldn) or Community Noise Equivalent Level (CNEL). These two expressions of average sound levels are nearly equivalent, and while this Noise Element usually refers to CNEL, standards cited from certain state and federal regulations may use Ldn.

Human perception of sound loudness, however, is subjective. Everyday sounds normally range from 30 dBA (very quiet such as a soft whisper) to 100 dBA (very loud such as the noise produced by a jet takeoff at a distance of 200 feet). In general, noise may become a nuisance at levels of 45 dBA CNEL or greater. Psychological and physiological stress are common with noise levels in the 65 to 75 dBA CNEL range, and hearing loss can occur at noise levels of 75 dBA CNEL or more.

A-Weighted Level (dBA): The sound level in decibels as measured on a sound level meter using the Aweighting filter network. The Aweighting filter deemphasizes the very low and very high frequency components of the sound in a manner similar to the response of the human ear and gives good correlation with subjective reactions to noise.

The California Department of Health Services has developed criteria and guidelines for local governments to use when setting standards for human exposure to noise and preparing noise elements for general plans. These guidelines include noise exposure levels for both exterior and interior environments. In addition, Title 25, Section 1092 of the California Code of Regulations, sets forth requirements for the insulation of multiple-family residential dwelling units from excessive and potentially harmful noise. These guidelines indicate that locating units in areas where exterior ambient noise levels exceed 65 dBA CNEL is undesirable, and require the developer to incorporate into building design construction features that will reduce interior noise levels to 45 dBA CNEL. Title 21, Subchapter 6 of the California Administrative Code, establishes noise standards related to airports. According to Title 21, an airport should maintain a noise impact area wherein no residential uses would be located within the 65-dB-CNEL contour. If noise levels exceed this standard for residences and other sensitive receptors, avigation easements and soundproofing of interior space are required.

NE 1.3 Noise Buffers. [GP] When feasible, the City should require an open space or other noise buffer between new projects that are a source of noise and nearby sensitive receptors. The nature and extent of the noise buffer shall be determined based upon site-specific conditions. NE 1.4 Acoustical Studies. [GP] An acoustical study that includes field measurement of noise levels may be required for any proposed project that would: a) locate a potentially intrusive noise source near an existing sensitive receptor, or b) locate a noise-sensitive land use near an existing known or potentially intrusive noise source such as a freeway, arterial roadway, railroad, industrial facility, or airport traffic pattern. Acoustical studies should identify noise sources, magnitudes, and potential noise mitigation measures and describe existing and future noise exposure. The acoustical study shall be funded by the applicant and conducted by a qualified person or firm that is experienced in the fields of environmental noise assessment and architectural acoustics. The determination of applicability of this requirement shall be made by the Planning and Environmental Services Department by applying the standards and criteria of Table 9-2.

Exhibit 4 - Understanding and comparing the sound measurement of various noises


Noise is an unavoidable aspect of any built environment. Noise is defined as a sound or series of sounds that are perceived as irritating, objectionable, and/or disruptive to the quality of daily life. Levels of noise are measured in decibels (dB) and are typically expressed as A-weighted decibels (dBA). The A-weighted decibel scale adjusts for very high and very low sound frequencies that are inaudible to humans.

It is helpful in understand these measurements by comparing the level for various sounds that are familiar. The chart below lists many common sounds along with the level of noise created as measured in decimals.

Amplitude Attenuation with Distance

Sound originating from a small point source will spread spherically in all directions, absent any nearby surfaces. The conservation of energy requires the sound pressure spreading out from such a source to decrease by half with each doubling of distance. This is known as the inverse square law and is demonstrated in Table A2.1 and Figure A2.5. source: Spendiarian & Willis Acoustics & Noise Control LLC





Figure A2.5. Decrease of SPL with Distance Due to Spherical Spreading

Adding Decibels

Summing the contributions from multiple sound sources to obtain the total SPL is *not* done simply by adding the decibel levels because SPL is a logarithmic quantity. Imagine a fan produces a moderate SPL of 65 dBA at 6 feet. If a second identical fan were turned on the resulting SPL would not be 130 dBA. This would be equivalent to a commercial jetliner taking off at close range. The correct method of adding the SPL from each source is to sum the acoustic power produced by each source. This implies that each time the number of sources having equal SPL is doubled, the SPL will increase by 3 dBA. Therefore, in the example with two fans, the correct total SPL would be 68 dBA. More examples with multiple sources producing equal SPL are shown in Figure A2.6. 65 dBA + 65 dBA ¹ 130 dBA **WRONG** (A2.2)







Figure 4-5: City of Goleta Generational Breakdown





Exhibit 6 – Health and Community Attributes Associated with Pickleball




Inactivity Levels by Income



Market Potential Index (NPI)

A Market Potential Index (MPI) measures the probable demand for a product or service within each Region. The MPI shows the likelihood that an adult resident will participate in certain activities when compared to the U.S. national average. The national average is 100; therefore, numbers below 100 would represent lower than average participation rates, and numbers above 100 would represent higher than average participation rates. The following table displays shows sport and leisure market potential data for each region across the US. Goleta is located in the Pacific Region demonstrates the highest MPI score when compared to all other regions. This above average market potential index score (136); indicates that Pacific Region residents have a rather strong participation presence when it comes to Pickleball. This becomes significant when municipalities within this region consider starting up Pickleball programs or building Pickleball new facilities.



Health Benefits

Research Results - Health Benefits Resulting from Pickleball

The popularity has led to researchers and physicians to study the health benefits. The results overwhelming support that pickleball provides tremendous health activities to all ages. Social and fun factors make this a sport that is not readily dropped, like is experienced with other exercise; therefore, it can be a magnet for cities in building health programs. The fun factor and social aspects lead this sport to an activity that individuals do over and over and leads to expansion among family members, friends and community resulting in healthy community.

A professor at Walden University has reviewed several studies on the health and social benefits of playing pickleball and has summarized the findings as follows: Research studies have consistently found that playing pickleball improves the bio-psycho-social dimensions of the people who play it. Numerous research studies with middle and senior aged adults have found that playing pickleball improves people's daily lives, their wellbeing, and contributes to successful aging. A study of older adults found that serious leisure through pickleball is important for their wellbeing and for middle aged people who are employed and play pickleball it contributes to their career progress and wards off depression as their retirement looms. Other studies of people who play pickleball found that it helps them maintain a healthy lifestyle, enhances their self-image and self-expression, provides for positive social interactions and improves their social relationships, thus improving their personal growth, health, happiness, and life satisfaction in retirement. Physiological studies have found that pickleball improves cardiovascular fitness, modifies and reduces risk factors for cardiovascular disease, improves metabolic rates and more calories are burned, improves cholesterol's high-density lipoproteins and low-density lipoprotein numbers, improves both systolic and diastolic blood pressure, and the maximal oxygen uptake in the lungs and blood. These physiological improvements through playing pickleball are better than the benefits of daily walking.

Researchers in the High Altitude Exercise Physiology Program at Western State Colorado University, led by Lance Dalleck, Ph.D.. The purpose of their study was to quantify the acute cardiovascular and metabolic responses to Pickleball, and to determine the effectiveness of a six-week Pickleball intervention at positively modifying cardiometabolic risk factors. The primary finding of this study is that regular participation in Pickleball elicits cardiovascular and metabolic responses that meet exercise intensity guidelines for improving and maintaining cardiorespiratory fitness, with the average caloric expenditure equaling approximately 350 calories per 60 minutes of participation. Collectively, these findings support Pickleball as an ideal form of physical activity for middle-aged and older adults. Decreased cardiorespiratory fitness contributes to reduced functional capacity and can eventually result in a loss of independence. In fact, low cardiorespiratory fitness may contribute to premature mortality for members of the population evaluated in this study. For these reasons, adding pickleball to an exercise routines is a great idea. Combine the findings of this research with the participants' enjoyment of the game and you really do have an ideal form of physical activity. It's important to highlight that the research team observed a lot of socializing, conversation and laughter before, during and after the Pickleball matches. As Dr. Dalleck reminds us, "This type of social support is tremendously valuable when it comes to long-term adherence." After just six weeks, participants saw favorable changes in high-density lipoprotein (HDL) and low-density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol, systolic and diastolic blood pressure, and V • O2max. Pick up a paddle to protect your heart, boost your mood, and more! By now you've heard of pickleball. The increasingly popular paddle sport, which has similarities to tennis and ping pong, has attracted players of all ages and fitness levels—but especially active older adults. What's so great about it?

For starters, it's incredibly accessible. You can input your zip code on the U.S.A. Pickleball Association website to find out where to play near you. Beginners are always welcome, equipment is often provided, and the rules are easy to learn. Among the reasons older adults love pickleball: The court is small enough that you don't need to move much to hit the ball, especially if you're playing doubles. The game encourages players to socialize. There's none of the frustration factor that accompanies sports like golf—it's designed to be carefree and fun. "Pickleball is a great sport for active living across the lifetime," says Jonathan Casper, Ph.D., an associate professor of sports management at North Carolina State University. "Because it's similar to other racquet sports, you can learn the game pretty quickly, and you can play for as long as your body will let you." If that's not reason enough to give it a try, consider these five health perks of playing pickleball.

Pickleball Benefit #1: You'll Lower Your Risk of Heart Disease

A recent study in the *International Journal of Research in Exercise Physiology* found middle-aged and older adults who played one hour of pickleball three days per week for six weeks improved their blood pressure, cholesterol, and cardiorespiratory fitness levels.

"These positive changes to heart health are significant, as a large number of adults have elevated cholesterol levels, hypertension, or low cardiorespiratory endurance, which puts them at increased risk of cardiovascular disease," says study author Lance Dalleck, Ph.D., an associate professor of exercise and sport science at Western Colorado University.

Pickleball Benefit #2: You'll Cut Your Risk of Depression

Exercise in general is a proven mood booster—and pickleball is no exception. A recent study in *Leisure Studies* found older adults who played in pickleball tournaments had a lower risk of depression. "I believe it makes older adults' lives richer and happier," says study author Jungsu Ryu, Ph.D., an assistant professor of sport management at Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia. "Engaging seriously in playing pickleball may buffer any type of negative emotions that people have during transitions to retirement and later life." If tournaments aren't for you, no problem. The important thing is the commitment to pickleball as serious leisure, or the continued pursuit of a sport or hobby so you gain special skills, knowledge, and experience.

Pickleball Benefit #3: You'll Get Hooked on Exercise

Many older adults start playing pickleball because a friend or partner suggests they join them one day. Some may be skeptical when they arrive, but more often than not, they enjoy it enough to come back for more, Casper says. Science offers one explanation: A study in the *Journal of Aging and Physical Activity* found people become loyal to the sport because it helps them meet their fitness goals and enhance social connections. It's a two-for-one workout! "Sometimes people are more willing to play a sport when it's fun, and people report that playing pickleball is way more fun than going for a walk or going on the treadmill," says Casper, the study author. "If you were to spend 60 minutes in the gym," he continues, "it usually feels like 60 minutes. But when you're doing something you enjoy, like pickleball, where you typically have time to talk and laugh in the game, all of a sudden you've been playing for 60 minutes and you think, 'Where did the time go?'" Only about 20 percent of adults get the recommended amount of physical activity each week, according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. That means a lot of people may need to find an activity they'll stick to—and pickleball may be the ticket.

Pickleball Benefit #4: You'll Socialize More—and Feel Less Lonely

Pickleball is a great social outlet. And that desire to connect with friends will keep you coming back again and again. "There's this fun aspect, which really ties into social support," says Chris Gagliardi, a spokesperson for the American Council on Exercise. "It's not this individual journey, like going to the gym by yourself to walk on the treadmill," he says. "You can play doubles, you can have a teammate, and someone is expecting you. For some people, it can be the only socializing they may have that week." Even while on the court, interactions between pickleball players are different from those in other physical activities, Casper says. "Because this is a sport with two people playing together, you have that engagement," he says. "And people are so passionate about pickleball—they look for opportunities to show other people and share their enjoyment. That's more so with pickleball than any other sport that I've studied." Plus, knowing that someone is depending on you may give you a greater sense of purpose and increase your devotion to the game even more. "If you were my workout partner and you didn't show up, I could still get my workout in," Gagliardi says. "But in pickleball, the game couldn't take place if you didn't show up. You have a lot riding on it." Get along really well with your pickleball pals? Why not extend the outing with coffee or lunch afterward—or plan one of these fun friend dates?

Pickleball Benefit #5: You May Stay Independent Longer

Older adults who play pickleball regularly may improve their reflexes and balance, which can help you live independently for longer, Gagliardi says. You may also improve your range of motion, which can help minimize arthritis symptoms that prevent you from performing everyday tasks with ease. "As a result of not being physically active, you typically lose range of motion," Gagliardi says. "If you're doing something you enjoy, you're more likely to do it. "But also, with pickleball, you have to think about the strategy and the hand-eye coordination," he explains. "If you're sedentary, you're not doing that at all."


Participation Levels

In the Sports & Fitness Industry Association (SFIA) 2017 Pickleball Participant Report, it was reported that pickleball currently has 3.1 million players in the US – an increase of 12% over the previous year. In 2016, SFIA produced a detailed Pickleball Participation Report which provided the following details.

- 1.57 million were "Casual" participants who play 1-7 times a year
- 930 thousand were "Core" participants who play 8 or more times a year
- The rate of growth in participation from 2014 to 2015 was 1.8%, from 2.462 million to million (Note: this growth rate is likely underestimated since 2014 was the first year for including pickleball in the SFIA report and the base number is questionable
- Casual were 63% male and 37% female
- Core were 73% male and 27% female
- The age breakdown for Casual and Core are very different... with Core players being, on average, significantly older
 - o ages 6-17: Casual 18.5%; Core 0.8%
 - o ages 18-34: Casual 11.7%; Core 5.5%
 - o ages 35-54: Casual 29.4%; Core 19.2%
 - o ages 55-64: Casual 7.7%; Core 31.8%
 - o age 65+: Casual 5.4%; Core 42.7%
- 13% of Casual participants and 75% of Core participants are age 55 and older
- The 2.5 million participants represent 0.9% of the US population
- The regions with the largest number of Core participants were Pacific (CA, OR, WA) = 263,000; East North Central (WI, MI, IL, OH, IN) = 200,000; South Atlantic (FL, GA, SC, NC, VA, WV, DC) = 174,000
- 2018, and beyond, represents the greatest opportunity for Pickleball's growth, thanks to a combination of intangibles:
 - Growth of young players and newcomers to the game
 - o Surge in new construction of Pickleball courts and facilities
 - Retrofitting of tennis courts for Pickleball use nationwide
 - International media exposure
 - Widespread exposure from digital and social media outlets dedicated exclusively to Pickleball
- Consistent grassroots publicity
- Influx of tennis players into the profession
- Increase in pro-shops carrying Pickleball equipment
- Unwavering commitment to players of all levels -- beginner to pro -- from Pickleball equipment companies and sporting goods brands, alike.

Places to Play

The following chart illustrates the growth in the number of courts and places to play. For example, in 2017 there were 21,051 courts, an increase of 124% over 9,396 courts in 2014. Likewise, the number of places to play has increased from 2,881 in 2014 to 5,811 in 2017 for an increase of 101.7%. Note that there are some differences in the statistics listed below and those listed are the next page. The key takeaway is that there has been tremendous growth in pickleball over the last few years.



Expansion of US Pickleball Complexes from Municipalities to Commercialization

The explosive popularity and growth of pickleball has even made it a profitable and franchisee businesses. A simple google search indicates that across the country municipalities and investors are placing millions into building restaurant pickleball facilities, pickleball clubs and complexes. Meanwhile according to AZ Sun News Oct 2021 - "Municipalities can't keep up with the demand for more free places to play and have spent millions of dollars over the last five years to try to feed the voracious appetite for courts." Even resort hotels are racing to replace tennis courts with dedicated pickleball to meet the high demand and attract visitors.





A reclassification of the GVCC courts from Tennis to Pickleball and completing the needed approvements aligns with many of the goals and recommendations stated in the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playground Master Plan Goals and Recommendations

Recommendations that Help to Increase Recreational Programs

The basis of determining core services should come from the vision and mission developed by the city and what brings the greatest community benefit in balance with the competencies of the division, current trends and the market. The City should pursue program development around the priorities identified by customer feedback, program evaluation process, and research. Those following criteria should be examined when developing new programs:

- Need: outgrowth of a current popular program, or enough demonstrated demand to successfully support a minimal start (one class for instance)
- Budget: accounting for all costs and anticipated (conservative) revenues should meet cost recovery target established by the Department
- Location: appropriate, available and within budget
- Instructor: qualified, available and within budget
- Materials and supplies: available and within budget
- Marketing effort: adequate and timely opportunity to reach intended market, within budget

Parks standards are not only about the quantity of parks, but also about the equitable distribution of these facilities and the ability of the public to access these facilities. As stated in the General Plan Open Space Policy 6.2, "to the extent feasible, park and recreation facilities shall be equitably distributed throughout the city to serve the various neighborhoods and all socioeconomic segments of the city's population. Particular emphasis shall be placed on provision of new park and recreation facilities in areas that are underserved."

<u>Objective 10.2</u> As a result of reviewing the entire parks systems for available undeveloped space or underdeveloped space, **consider** adding infill sports fields to the following existing parks:

Evergreen Park, Goleta Community Center, Stow Grove Park, Jonny D. Wallis Park

<u>Objective 10.5</u> Annually update sports facility needs based on standards from the Needs Assessment or use national standards. It is recommended that the City should carry out small additions of new sports facilities on an annual basis to reduce the current deficit. Annual investments should be applied to item 10.2 to 10.3 first..

<u>Objective 11.2</u> Upgrade convenience and customer service amenities to existing facilities to increase usability and access to more. The Division should investigate opportunities to add shade, storage buildings, security enhancements, lighting, benches, and other amenities appropriately at existing facilities as it is making improvements and augmenting existing facilities. These improvements may increase capacity or use levels if they are offered.

Objective 11.3 Create additional recreational facilities and amenities at existing parks. The prioritized facilities should be based on needs assessment and a higher priority put on those amenities that have the greatest citywide deficiency. Based on the existing facilities analysis and the LOS analysis, recommendations have been made for what types of facilities are needed. It is recommended that the City include the addition of these facilities and any ancillary improvements that will need to be done in order to accommodate these facilities in the Capital Improvement Program for design and implementation

<u>Objective 11.4</u> Identify where existing missing amenities can go as part of new park development. Once it has been decided that a new park is needed or that a park is to be partially built/funded by a development, then consider having the Master Plan work into the overall design the missing facilities that are deficient either in the immediate area or citywide.

Objective 15.2 Routinely analyze the usage of the programs, facilities, and services and make appropriate adjustments based on collected data. The Division should routinely measure the amount of participation in its facilities and services to determine the levels of usage and identify any trends in this usage. With this data, the Division can make appropriate changes to its supporting facilities or agreements with program providers to reflect this demand.

Objective 15.3 Work with other service providers to enhance/develop programs to address changing needs and trends.

As needs and trends change, work with other recreation providers to supplement the needs of changing interests. Create agreements in writing with the service providers. Develop a web site where a member of the community can find out about all the other service providers' recreational opportunities

Consider a proposal by the Goleta Valley Community Center Organization to repurpose the existing tennis courts for pickleball use and provide a recommendation to City Council related to the recreation use compatibility based on community need and existing adopted City Parks and Recreation related plans.

The purview of the Commission is to evaluate the use and proposed conversion of existing basketball/tennis courts at a city facility into pickleball courts with one basketball court. The Commission is being asked to determine whether this conversion meets the recreational needs of the community, namely how it aligns with the 2015 Recreation Needs Assessment and the 2021 Parks, Playgrounds and Facilities Master Plan.

Decision: Committee supported Vote: 4 yeas 3 nays

Public Comment: A meeting notice was mailed to all area residents in addition to the normal posting of this meeting notice in order to generate significant public comments and concerns.

Public Concerns submitted: Only 3 letters received expressing any concerns. No public comments expressed any concern or negativity. The 3 individuals did not attend the virtual meeting and some items expressed could not be substantiated, deemed invalid or exaggerated.

Public Support submitted (see excerpts below): Approximately 135 citizens attended the zoom session. Over 400 positive and supportive letters along with 13 public comments containing amazing stories supporting a permanent/dedicated pickleball facility at GVCC, improving the facilities at GVCC and considering expanding those facilities in the future.

Public Comment at meeting:

13 citizens spoke, only positive supportive comments along with personal touching stories including:

- An individual who attributes 60lbs of weight loss to pickleball and the GVCC courts
- An individual who recently had heart surgery and uses the courts for rehab
- An individual whose special needs son has been welcomed at GVCC courts, gaining more confidence/interaction with others
- An individual from the Winslow community indicating they enjoy the facility and they do not hear the noise from Winslow
- An individual who feels GVCC fosters community and builds unity
- A UCSB student attributing GVCC pickleball as breaking the "IV bubble" meeting more people and discovering Old Town
- A 73 year-old explaining the huge benefits of pickleball and allowing him to get out with others and stay physically fit
- · Goleta businesses using GVCC pickleball courts for team building and competition among other business
- Several individuals mentioned GVCC pickleball courts allowed them to discover GVCC and Old Town businesses which they
 previously ignored and now frequently go to these businesses
- Several mentioned the attributes of meeting new friends, community, help during Covid, the health benefits and how GVCC pickleball courts got them exercising and the need for local courts with lights

Excerpts Public Comments on GVCC Pickleball (more than 400 positive letters received)

I'd like to state how much I love and enjoy the pickleball courts... I have made so many friendships and it has helped me thru Covid... it has especially helped my mental and physical well-being.

I retired a few years ago after serving our community as the director of CALM, for 31 years, I worked with the most at risk families in our community I was happy to discover an activity that met my social, recreational and physical needs right here in my backyard. Pickleball!! I along with hundreds of other people are visiting this side of Goleta several times a week just to partake of this healthy activity. The courts are a little run down and need an upgrade. I urge you to recommend the necessary fixes so that we can continue this activity right here in Goleta Old Town.

I love playing at the Goleta courts because the country atmosphere and relaxed vibe offers a nice alternative to the more competitive spirit than at the muni courts. Pickleball is a feel good, health inducing activity (beyond a sport) that enriches my life in innumerable ways; great exercise, socially engaging, mentally and emotionally challenging, spurring personal growth and wellbeing, just to name a few! I've also discovered that the city of Goleta has a lot to offer for after game activities, such as food shopping

My wife and I are fairly new to the pickleball community. We are both 73 years old now and over the span of our 50 years of married life together we have tried many different sports for recreational enjoyment as well as to maintain and improve our level of fitness. ... Not only are we getting in some healthy exercise, but we also really enjoy the social aspects of getting to now and recreate with a whole newgroup of like minded, fun loving and healthy friends. I feel that it is very important that the Goleta Recreation Commission does everything within its power to not only keep those 5 pickleball courts open to our local community but also proceed with haste to make the needed improvements.

I represent 37 homeowners at Willow Creek Townhomes Association at 345 Kellogg Way in Old Town Goleta. We are the closest residential complex to the Community Center and the pickleball courts. Our residents have not expressed any complaints about the pickleball courts or the court lights. Quite the opposite. Many of our residents enjoy playing on the courts and feel that the courts are a significant improvement from the rarely used tennis courts. For many working individuals, the lighted courts are their only chance to play pickleball is after work. Our homeowners association strongly supports renovating the courts for permanent pickleball use. The former tennis courts have had a long history of very little use, and a gathering place for unsavory individuals which has been a public safety issue for years.

I would not be exaggerating if I said that pickleball has changed my life. There are few hobbies where you meet new people on such a regular basis. The interpersonal connections cannot be overstated nor can the benefits. We are in trying times, and PB is an outlet that is fun and good for the body and soul. People are smiling ear to ear when they are playing or even waiting to play.

My oldest son attended the Goleta Valley Boys and Girls Club after school program. Being a tennis player I remember the tennis court and wondering why it was never utilized? Kids were swinging on the net, the court was littered with graffiti, the basketball net torn...

I LOVE pickleball. I am 62-years-old and I have had a kidney transplant for almost 31 years. I am sun-sensitive (continually fight skin cancers), so being able to play pickleball until 8pm has given me a new sense of freedom. Playing pickleball without having to be completely covered in sunprotection clothing, has given me a new sense of myself.

The pickleball community has been a life line for so many during this particularly challenging Covid season. The physical and mental health benefits of this sport and more importantly the social community has kept my family afloat in so many ways.

I have many physical ailments including, but not limited to: broken toes, ankles that have been casted many times, double-knee replacements, pulled out both hips, stenosis in both my back and neck that require surgery, numb arms because of the stenosis, both thumb muscles are blown, ulnar tendon is blown so I can't turn my right wrist, systemic rheumatoid arthritis, and I am now recovering from radiation treatment for prostate cancer. About 5 years ago, I "found" pickleball. Today, I play it an average of 4 days a week and 3-4 hours per outing. Pickleball has literally saved my life.

We tried a variety of sports that could be played safely outdoors and stumbled our way into the pickleball community. It has been an incredible boon to us to find such a community, especially for my wife, for whom English is not her native language. Being able to play this sport with others has enabled her to find a sense of community and friendships that transcend a language barrier. GVCC is where that all started

I discovered a new passion called Pickleball. Having the courts to go to at GVCC have really been awesome for my physical and mental well-being. This is a sport I plan to play for years and as a full time working professional, having courts with lights are critical for me to be able to get to play!

I have been a resident of Goleta since the late 60s, and a homeowner in Goleta since 1993. I recently took up Pickleball and the Goleta Valley community Center is one of the few places available to play. Just recently having lights on the courts after 5 o'clock makes it even more critical.

I would like to express my support for pickleball at the Goleta Valley Community Center. Currently, this is the only place in Santa Barbara area with lighted courts for pickleball. My wife and I are still part of the workforce and generally work from 9am to 5pm. This leaves little time for activity in the evening as the sun goes down early in winter.. Having the courts at GVCC allows us to get exercise after work.

I just wanted to express how much I enjoy the pickleball courts in Old Town Goleta. These friendships I have made through pickleball, helped make the isolation felt during the pandemic so much more bearable. Ever since the Pickleball courts were created, I have frequented downtown Goleta and the many businesses there on my 3-5 days of playing pickleball. I frequent Santa Barbara Cider, Elubia's Kitchen, Unibol, Habit Burger, Taco

Bell, Goleta Sushi House, the Gas Station, The Liquor Store and 7-11 for Gatorade, and Santa Cruz Market. I have also introduced a number of friends to these pickleball courts and various restaurants in Old Town.

I am writing in support of the pickleball court resurface project at GVCC. Over the past 1-2 year I have come to rely on these courts as a sanctuary of sorts. As an ICU nurse at SB Cottage Hospital, the pandemic created some of the most stressful and chaotic days I have ever dealt with. Pickleball has been essential to my mental health during this time. I am not alone in this regard. Other Cottage Hospital employees I have played with besides nurses include physicians, anesthesiologists, respiratory therapists, radiology techs, patient care techs, unit coordinators, and physical therapists to name a few.

What a godsend! Thanks to all who helped get the courts up and running! After entering into retirement last Nov 2020 and dealing w/covid already Most of last year...Thank you for your continued Efforts in making GVCC a enjoyable, fun place for all ages to work out and put A smile to our faces!

I am writing to tell you how much I enjoy playing pickle ball at GVCC. In addition to the health benefits of the game (my cardiologist at Cedar Sinai says pickle ball is the perfect heart interval exercise for cardiac rehab), I actually support business in the area. I just love going thrift shopping, something I wouldn't do if I were not in old town. I used to play at Muni but now I am playing more in Goleta. It is a wonderfully friendly group with all levels of play. I love the paddle system. It keeps the game from becoming "exclusive", which is happening at SB Muni.

As a nurse practitioner I have found that getting people to exercise, especially getting cardio activities into their daily life, isn't an easy thing to do From my perspective, the more our community encourages, supports and assists such activities, this makes for a healthier populace with fewer cases of hypertension, diabetes, cardiovascular diseases and obesity. Additionally, the mental health of so many has been negatively impacted by Covid and the positive social relationships are a wonderful side effect of an active populace.

It's been the single best thing to help me through this past year. And now I never want to stop playing... it's so much fun, I get exercise, I meet new friends, It's a game the whole family can play.

The GVCC courts have provided myself, my wife and my kids with a new activity that we all share in. How often can you say that your 21 year old kid is excited to go do an activity with you! That's the power of pickleball, people from all ages, all walks of life, getting together and having a great time outside in the fresh air. GVCC also, have to only courts with lights, which allows many of us to play after work and then grab dinner or a drink at many of the local establishments nearby.... It's time for Goleta to take the next step and make these courts a shining example of how the city hears and supports its residents.

I am writing this in HUGE support for GVCC PICKELBALL. This place has made such a difference in my life physically and emotionally. To be able to connect with so many people of all ages and walks of life is really amazing! Playing at GVCC and seeing 20 to 30 friendly faces just makes my day! There's really nothing quite like it.

To close the courts would be a huge disservice to not just the people that play but for the future of the sport as well as business for Goleta. There are so many positive reasons to resurface and keep our pickleball community alive.

I am a retired school teacher - I've lived in Goleta for 40 years just a few miles from GVCC. I believe Goleta Valley PBall courts are so important for many reasons. I have met so many people through this sport, have maintained a healthy lifestyle, and have contributed economically to surrounding businesses in Old Town Goleta which I would never have visited before. Please make the GVCC courts permanent and even consider adding more courts. I strongly believe this will not only benefit me but benefit our community as a whole. I believe Goleta Valley Pickleball courts are vital for the flourishing of the city of Goleta.

The pickleball recreation at the GVCC has been such a blessing to our community. It's been essential during the time of this pandemic (the players have consistently been responsible and observing covid protocol and mutual respect). But beyond that, this is exactly what the city of Goleta needs to be a more cohesive, inviting, warm community. This is what the CV Community center exists for! People playing, chatting and laughing, etc on the property that has been designated and zoned for public recreation

Pickleball is a really fun sport. My husband and I (75 & 78 years!) have played regularly for the past three years. We have met so many nice people through pickleball and appreciate the camaraderie the sport provides. It is also really good exercise! It has provided regular times of fun and stress reduction during COVID.

Pickleball is a lot easier to play than Tennis. It's also easier on my body and a lot more social. I meet a lot of people, with tennis only 2-4 people play and you never talk with anyone else. Pickleball allows that community interaction – I appreciate Goleta a lot more now and I'm so glad the city is supporting Pickleball.

I came to USCB in 1988 and never left, My son played soccer in a league at the Goleta Boys and Girls Club. My wife works for a non-profit in a commercial building directly across Hollister Avenue from GVCC. We love it here. The pickleball courts at GVCC have only enhanced our enjoyment of Goleta.

Not only is pickleball a great sport and physical exercise, but it naturally draws people from all walks of life. The number of friendships and connections I have seen develop has been impressive. The courts at GVCC also draw significant business to the Old Town area. We now frequent Altamirano's after our Sunday-night sessions for incredible street tacos. Many of us enjoy a post-game beer at the recently-opened Centennial Beer

Please make the GVCC courts permanent and even consider adding more courts every Sunday night he gets to play, laugh, compete with a great group of other business men, church friends, local teachers and coaches. It has become a great place of connection

They are also the only courts in town with lights, so that we can play in the evenings during this time change. We would honestly be devastated if that were to ever change.

The GVCC courts are only some of very few available to Goleta residents and this is a much needed resource in our community During COVID, having pickleball as an outdoor activity has literally helped me stay sane. During the winter, there are not many outdoor options for exercise, but the lights at GVCC allow people who work during the day to still be active after work.

The exercise combined with the social aspect has turned the GVCC courts into my "happy place". I can't think of another situation where the community, in all age groups, can come together and have fun. I have played pickleball with people from the age range of 9-90. It has also made

Please allow the courts to remain open. These courts have allowed our community to be together in a pandemic..keeping mental and physical health...There are many residents in our town who live near city recreation buildings including schools ...These courts are a positive for all in our community. – Classroom Teacher

I have participated in 2 clinics (to raise funds to improve the courts) and lessons. I play 3 to 4 days a week now and have made countless friends in doing so. This all has put joy back in my life at the same time keeps me feeling healthy both mentally and physically.

Pickleball supports a healthy lifestyle both mentally and physically. I have many new friendships from playing at the GVCC courts and have grown to appreciate Old Town Goleta for it's community and unique quaintness. I am 13 years old and LOVE being able to play pickleball with my family, and other adults!

Hundreds of people who work hard in the cities of Goleta and Santa Barbara (like nurses, engineers, college students, graduate students, pastors, grandparents, teachers, etc.) have had a safe way to exercise and de-stress during this intense season of COVID because of these courts.

The GVCC pickleball courts are the epitome of what a community center should be. A place for people from all different walks of life and backgrounds to come together and recreate. To come together and be united in a love for a sport that builds community, creates laughter and joy, and allows people who are working so hard to serve the city to have a break from the pressures of life...

We are three neighbors who live in the city of Goleta who play regularly at the GVCC courts and are very excited regarding the possibility of continuing to play there on resurfaced courts.

Our family has been using these courts ...It was a blessing ...These courts were unused and decrepit until fixed up... This is what the community center is for – The Community. The number of people benefiting from these courts is easily several hundred;

Overall there is no cost to the city. The city and local businesses are benefitting from our participation. We are forming a safe and healthy community. Pickleball is very popular and is growing rapidly. Take advantage of the help you have and support pickleball fully.

I have lived in Goleta for over 40 years. I believe Goleta Valley Pickleball courts are vital for the flourishing of the city of Goleta!

I have lost 10 lbs. gained stamina and balance which had faltered due to knee issues from running. GVCC pickleball has brought me back out to activity. I have 60 new friends all from pickleball there at GVCC. We have a great deal of fun, sharing laughs and singing and dancing during our games. I have seen these courts go from unused and deserted tennis/basketball courts literally with weeds growing up all over the place to the following5 courts that the community has rallied behind during Covid, to build up into pretty dang descent courts. Let's make these courts even better than they are! Let's get them resurfaced, so they are the best 5 courts in the area.

I am 12 years old and in the 7th grade and play pickleball. I love the GVCC courts and like playing there with my family! Please keep these courts open and improve the courts!

One of the wonderful things about these courts is that many folks, particularly older adults, who have been sidelined by injury or other health limitations are able to participate fully in playing pickleball here and have renewed their physical and social lives as a result.

Here at GVCC, grandparents play with college age grandchildren, men and women play together, experienced athletes encourage the participation of those who have never held a racquet or a paddle in their life.

The irrepressible fun of pickleball is so engaging that many 'exercise adverse' folks brag of having lost 10, 15 and even 40lbs of excess bodyweight as a byproduct of their regular play.

With four players to a 30'x60' court, there isn't a more efficient use of real estate set aside for community use. These courts represent community sport at its highest and best expression.

The City of Goleta only has 3 pickleball courts... one permanent court at Jonny Wallace and two temporary courts at Evergreen that have no nets. Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in USA. The City of Goleta should provide its community with what they need for fitness and well being. Three pickleball courts is not enough for The City of Goleta. The pickleball courts are the most used part of the Community Center at this time. There is great demand and the courts should be improved. There has been no maintenance to the courts in 25 years, so they are due for an upgrade.

The courts are supporting many events that are bringing folks from out of town to Old Town Goleta. They are supporting local business often... gas, food and sometimes even lodging. If the courts were improved, we can increase the number of tournaments and bring more folks to town.

I understand that the City of Goleta is taking up the issue of the pickleball courts at the Goleta Valley Community Center, including proposed upgrades and the issue of noise complaints. I wanted to take a minute to write an email in support of the courts and GVCC.

I have been a resident of the Goodland for many years, with the good fortune to afford a home in the El Encanto Heights area. I came to USCB in 1988 and never left, attending SBCC, Westmont College, and SB College of Law along my journey to a BA in Sociology and a law degree. My wife was born and raised in Santa Barbara. We have raised our kids entirely in the Goodland, with one in college and another a junior in high school. We spend most of our time in the Goleta area. My son played soccer in a league at the Goleta Boys and Girls Club. My wife works for a non-profit in a commercial building directly across Hollister Avenue from GVCC. We love it here. The pickleball courts at GVCC have only enhanced our enjoyment of Goleta.

Prior to the COVID pandemic, I had a few friends who were avid pickleball players. There is also dinner at other local restaurants, including The Hamburger Habit, Noodle City, and Goleta Sushi. Old Town Coffee has become a regular spot for many of us.

Upgrades to the courts as proposed would be incredible. I will play there regardless, but the improvements would be very much appreciated, would draw even more people to the area, would allow GVCC to host more tournaments and fundraisers, and would be a boon to the community. I don't know from where the noise complaints are emanating, but I can assure you that nothing that I have seen or heard is extraordinary. There is simply the game itself, the excitement of the competition, and the camaraderie that comes along with a community gathering for the shared love of an activity like pickleball. It is the epitome of good, clean fun.

My name is Chris and I would like to add my voice to those in favor of the Pickleball activity that has proven so popular at the Goleta Valley Community Center.

I have been invited to participate at the facility several times now and believe it is a fine addition to the downtown Goleta area... and what a great group of people! (and I have rediscovered downtown Goleta, where I have spent little time in recent years)

Having been a tennis player for 50 years and Pickleball for the last 3-1/2, and having been employed to provide instruction in both sports, I've been able to witness the astonishing growth of Pickleball. Although more and more schools are beginning to introduce youngsters to the game, a big part of that popularity can be attributed to it's approachability by folks in the second half of their active lives. Another is it's ability to keep four times as many players active in the same space as tennis. And lastly, the shorter "learning curve" to get to the point where one's skill level reaches the point of enjoyable play.

I have heard that pre-Covid 19 growth of the sport was at around 15% annually, and that in 2020 it grew 23% ...by far the fastest growing sport in the nation. (Tennis normally grows at 1 or 2% annually, if at all) The 4 new Kellogg courts will help a little, but the GVCC courts were badly needed also; and what a great way of making use of, and improving, an existing property... there are so few quality places to play.

I understand there is some concern about the sounds generated by the game in the surrounding area. I am no stranger to that... my wife and I having bought our home which backs up to an elementary school playground. But we knew we were taking up residence adjacent to a recreational area, and the daily sounds of people enjoying themselves beats a gas powered leaf blower every time. I would imagine the GVCC's recreation area with soccer field, basketball, the Goleta Boys and Girls Club, etc. would be afforded some "grandfathering", as was the case with Santa Barbara's Municipal Tennis facility when there was a challenge.

I hope that GVCC Pickleball will continue, as I am quite certain that it is a net positive for the community in terms of health and well-being.

Hello,

As a 6 year resident of Old Town Goleta living in the Michelle Apartments adjacent to the Goleta Community Center, I would like to voice some opinions and concerns on the matter of more Pickleball Courts being proposed.

One of the things I love about the community center is that it feels like the heart to Goleta. It's a beautiful building and has the potential for inclusivity of all Goleta's many diverse residents and their needs. Pickleball seems to be catering to mostly white community members, as I've seen on my many walks. I feel strongly that other sports should be considered for representation. Talk to the community as a whole, welcome them to the facility when it's safe again to do so, and allow your residents to see the space and share in the vision of what the community center could be for everyone.

Last year I spoke with, I believe it was the director, over at the community center regarding pickle ball players taking over the courts and asked if there would be other sports represented, as in but not limited to, equal share time of the courts for residents who want to practice outdoor yoga or tai chi, learning to roller skate, or a bike court for children to learn and practice how to ride a bike in a safe environment. While the director listened to my concerns, he eventually said that the pickleball players had offered to pay for the resurfacing the courts which was why pickleball was being represented. To me this makes it sound like the Goleta Community Center is basically for sale to the highest bidder willing to pay for their sport to be in the forefront. This is both elitist and non-inclusive behavior swinging the figurative door wide open for the gentrification of this community. Goleta's many diverse residents is what makes this such a wonderful place to live and raise a family, and the community center should be making sure all voices are being heard.

Additionally I voiced concern that the pickleball players are playing all day, from the early morning until late at night. They are not being considerate of the residents of the neighborhood. I work from home with a number of other residents in the area and all we hear all day long is the POP POP of the pickleball and loud talking and cheering from the players multiple hours of the day through the late evening hours, every day of the week. I was told by the director that I wasn't the first person to bring this issue up and that it would be addressed. It apparently never was because it just became worse over the last year. I can't have my windows open in my office during the day because of the continuous, monotonous sounds from the courts. I can't relax in my apartment in the evening and read a book without their noise making it unpleasant. Sometimes they play until 11PM or later if the weather is nice. If you're going to put more courts in, then there need to be restrictions on the play times, and mix other sports in so it's not just the monotony of the pickleball sounds. The courts should be treated like a park.... Sunrise to sunset at the very least, inclusive of diverse sports, not just focusing on the latest trend where money is being thrown around.

Thank you for you time and for reading through my concerns. I hope greatly that my voice is heard and that my talking points are taken into consideration and read aloud at the meeting.

The courts we are talking about were previously built for both Tennis and Basketball and for years were used for both, however for the last 15 years the courts have been underutilized except for the Boys and Girls Club usage and the occasional pick-up basketball.

Today, the courts have been revitalized by the GVCC staff, not as a combined tennis and basketball but as a combination of pickleball and basketball. The courts are vital to the Goleta Community in that they are providing an outdoor area for recreation, which contributes to the wellbeing of the players. Pickleball is the fastest growing sport across the country, and the Goleta Community Center Courts are the only lighted courts in Goleta. A large portion of players told the GVCC staff how important it was to have the lighted courts for those players wanting to play after work. It was both a stress reducer and a time to reconnect with friends and family while enjoying a wonderful outdoor recreational activity.

The Goleta Community Center has been called the "Gem of Goleta" refinishing the court surface with new paint, fixed permanent nets will make the "Gem of Goleta shine even brighter!

The revitalization of the courts and the back field has shined an even brighter light on the Goleta Community Center, it's helped introduce many more people to the Center and the various other activities that can be found here. Allowing the GVCC to move forward with their planned improvements to make the courts permanent will contribute to a healthier community. I have many physical ailments including, but not limited to: broken toes, ankles that have been casted many times, double-knee replacements, pulled out both hips, stenosis in both my back and neck that require surgery, numb arms because of the stenosis, both thumb muscles are blown, ulnar tendon is blown so I can't turn my right wrist, systemic rheumatoid arthritis, and I am now recovering from radiation treatment for prostate cancer.

About 5 years ago, I "found" pickleball. Today, I play it an average of 4 days a week and 3-4 hours per outing. Pickleball has literally saved my life. I have always been active, but thought that would come to an end because of my ailments.

Pickleball is an unusual game that allows players of different skill levels to compete on teh same court. Is a game that is very easy to pick up and impossible to master. It is the sport that requires more brain than brawn, but at the same time keeps the body healthy.

I was involved with GVCC from the very beginning. I played with Mike Myers when only one court was available. Mike and many others have contributed their time, energy, money and many other types of resources to make that location what it is today. When we start noone was using that facility. Even if people did, it was not safe and only a couple of people could be using it anyway. Now go out on an average open play day and you have all the courts filled with 20 players with 10 or so players waiting to play. That's about 30 community members talking, playing, and just in general communing with each other. There is no other city sponsored facility that can claim this kind of impact on so many people so frequently. If you go to an average park that requires so much maintenance on a weekly basis, you will see families and people milling about. That is great, but the level of interaction is minimal. The pickleball courts don't need to be mowed or swept or require any weekly maintenance at all. Yes, they will require re-surfacing and maybe some nets every so few years, but that is very low maintenance for the high-impact and high community involvement that they facilitate.

Pickleball is not the fastest growing sport by luck or circumstance. This sport is something special. It is for the very young to the very old. It is giving people a reason to get out of their houses, commune with each other, and stay healthy. I have found Pickleball especially good for the men of the community. Women are social and can find many reasons to be together. Men on the other hand usually don't get together or get together rarely to play sports that are very adversarial. Pickleball is a sport when men encourage men to be competitive, but also communal. We help each other with each others' games because better opponents make us better players. I can tell you that since I've been playing Pickleball I have never had such a large friend group. Without Pickleball I would be much more of a workaholic and much less social.

Sorry that this was so long, but I want you to know that I have been a life-long Goleta resident: Went to La Patera, Goleta Valley JH, Dos Pueblos, and worked at UCSB for 14 years. This is my home and I am super excited about Pickleball being a part of the community.

Good Evening,

I am writing in response to the invitation to provide input regarding the City of Goleta's proposal to renovate existing tennis courts located behind the Goleta Community Center into permanent pickleball courts. As much as I love pickleball and think it is great for the city to offer courts, the fact that the courts at the Community Center are so close to many residences presents a few challenges.

Residents on my street can hear the ball hit the paddle, all day, every day from 8am - 8pm. Sometimes earlier and often later. As I sit here typing, I am listening to the ping, ping, ping of the ball hitting the paddle. It is relentless. Initially, when the Community Center courts opened during the Pandemic, our family tried to tune out the noise, recognizing how wonderful it was for community members to get out of their homes and remain active during the Pandemic. But as time went on, after 9 months or so, the noise became a real nuisance. Many neighbors up and down our street reached out to the Community Center for a resolution. Many of us work from home and our offices and businesses also face the pickleball courts. We can't even eat dinner without listening to the noise. We can't open our windows.

In repeated emails back and forth with Charlie Johnson at the Community Center, my neighbors and I were told that our concerns were being taken seriously and that noise mitigation efforts, such as windscreen material with sound deadening qualities were being considered. The most recent email correspondence was in June 2021, but nothing ever changed with regard to noise mitigation.

If the City is to proceed with 5 permanent courts, this would create space for potentially 20 people to play pickleball at one time, all day long. This would be an even greater noise nuisance than we currently experience. Special ball and paddle requirements and regulating play times are one solution, but how would this realistically be enforced? Acoustic panels are another option, but very expensive. The issue of pickleball courts being a noise nuisance has become a huge problem as the sport has become popular again. Simply google "pickleball noise" and you will find hundreds of complaints, YouTube videos about noise complaints, newspaper articles, and city council meetings related to the same issue all over the Country. Courts are being placed recklessly without consideration to nearby neighbors. The City then has to deal with the problem it creates. Pickleball noise is often considered "noise pollution." Creating these courts is a liability for the City.

I want to emphasize that we hear a lot of noise from school children most days from the Community Center and the Boys and Girls Club and it is not a nuisance at all. We love to hear the children play, and we enjoy being close to the Community Center. However, it is the pickleball noise that is the problem.

Please consider finding a place for courts that is not in close proximity to homes and businesses. Please consider an alternative use for the current pickleball courts rather than making them permanent. It would be interesting to find out where people who regularly use the courts reside. How many are Old Town residents? I would guess that most people using the courts do not reside in Old Town.
