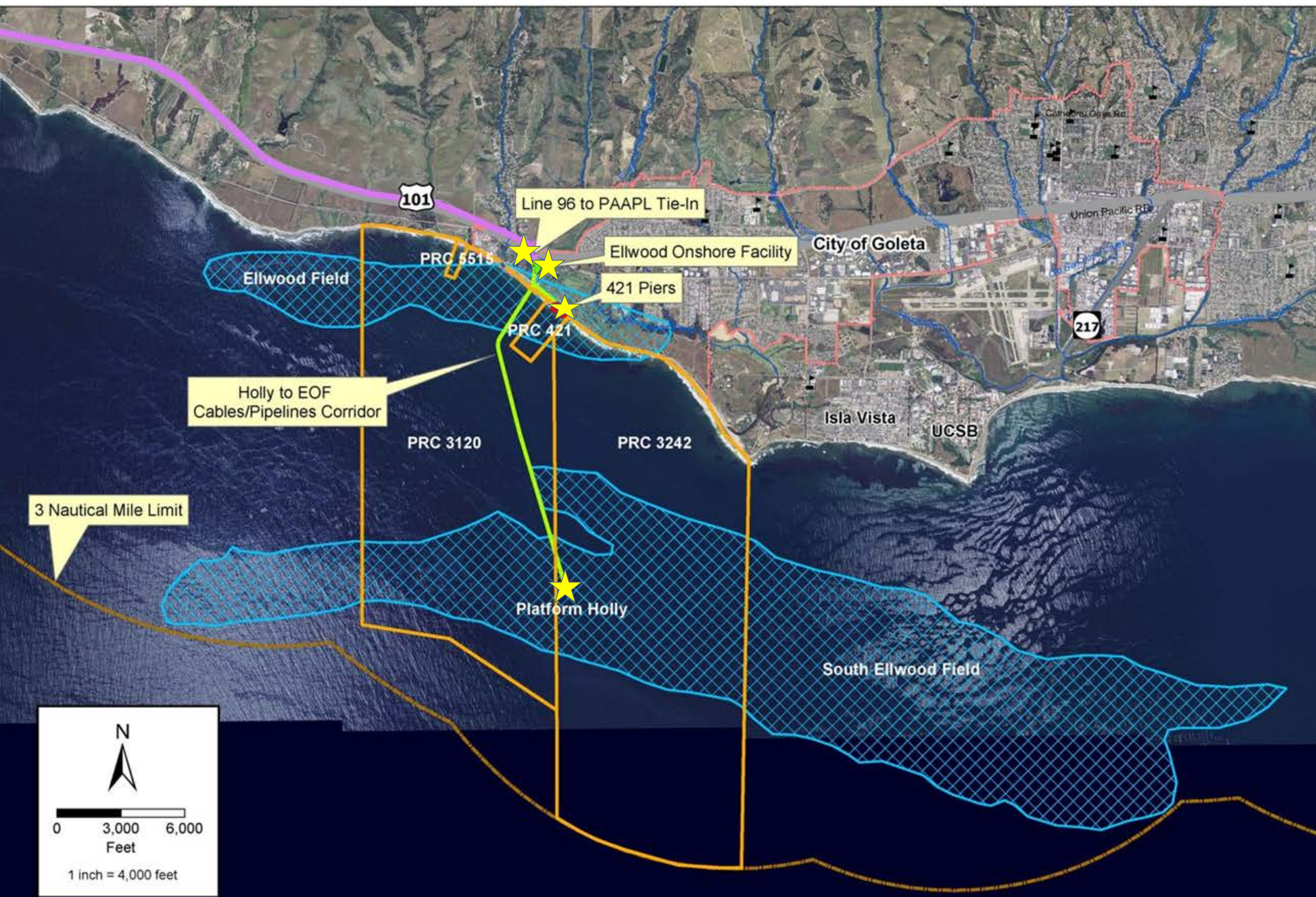

Background

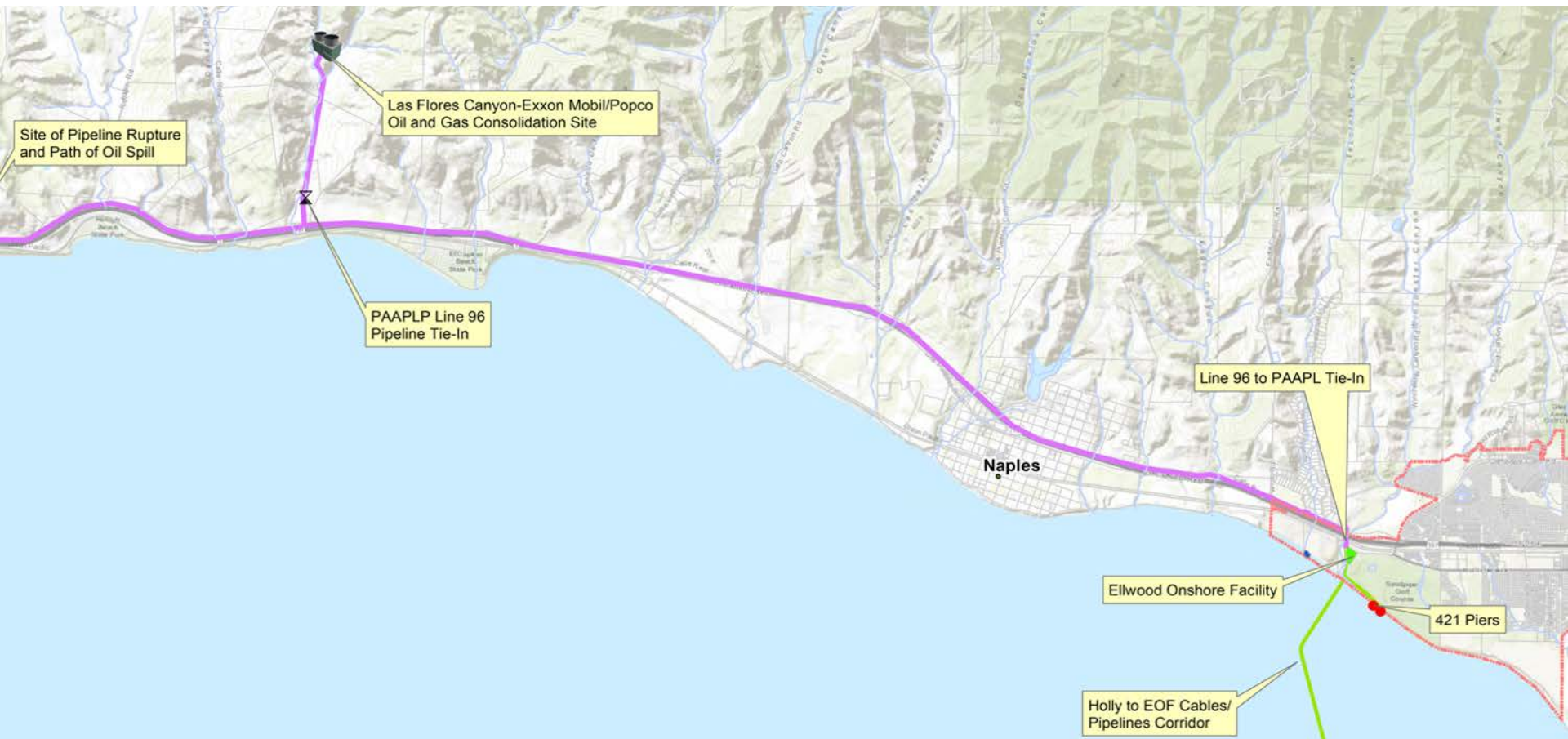
- April 17, 2017 Venoco quitclaim & bankruptcy
- Holly & 421 offshore facilities operated by State
- EOF/421 operated by State under negotiated agreement
- ExxonMobil upgrading Holly in preparation for P&A
- ExxonMobil upgrading the 421 road in preparation for P&A
- EOF and onshore roads used for material transport
- State is overseeing, contracting, & assuming liability for work

... City is relieved of regulatory responsibility / liability, as memorialized in negotiated MOU.

City Council Recommendation

Approve and authorize the City Manager to sign a MOU between the City and the California State Lands Commission for the transfer of management and oversight of Venoco's Ellwood Facilities from the City to the CSLC.
