City Council Compensation

City Council Meeting of April 17, 2018

- City of Goleta General Law City
 - Salary set by Ca Government Code
 - Increase as governed by Code
- Study included 71 cities, 44 General Law cities
- Comparison of Other General Law Cities
 - 44 cities reported compensation set by California Govt. Code
 - Population is not a factor in determining salary
- Charter Cities
 - Larger cities had higher compensation
 - May go to the voters for salary decisions
- Examples of Both General Law and Charter Cities with Ballot Measures
 - Paso Robles 2018 Ballot Measure for an increase of 60%, no increases for 12 years
 - Santa Barbara 2004 Ballot Measure
- Council Direction PEC Commission
 - Provided additional information related to Council duties and time commitments

Overview of Meeting Frequencies, Committee Assignments, Time Commitments

- City Council Meetings twice per month
- Most are Evening Only Meetings
- Committee Assignments Range in number and frequency in meetings
- Average hours reported from other cities 20-30 hours per week, ranging from week to week
- Average hours reported for City of Goleta 28-40 hours

Examples of Duties and Responsibilities

- Policy Making
- Preparing and attending meetings (City Council, Committee, outside boards, stakeholders)
- Attending city related functions, workshops, and community events
- Investigating and responding to citizen requests (telephone, email, social media, in person)
- Reviewing literature, correspondence, news, legislation, city reports, budget materials...

Public Engagement Commission Recommendation:

- 1. Councilmembers receive 75% of the single household median income of the 93117 zip code, and that annual adjustments to salary be made to stay aligned with the median income.
- 2. Mayor receive 90% of the single household median income of the 93117 zip code and the annual adjustments to salary be made to stay aligned with the median income.
- 3. The salary be implemented following the November 2018 election
- 4. Take affirmative action immediately, so that residents learn about the possibility of income should the measure pass.
- 5. The Commission felt very strongly that:

They believe an increase is in order to make it possible for a Councilmember to reside in Goleta, and to focus on the needs of the community and not be worried about income. The salary should reflect the workload of the Council and should be consistent with the cost of living.

Staff Recommendation:

- 1. Councilmembers 75% of the single household median income of the City of Goleta as published by the US Census Bureau (equal to \$42,134) and that annual adjustments be made using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) All Urban Consumers for Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim.
- 2. Mayor 90% of the single household median income of the City of Goleta as published by the US Census Bureau (equal to \$50,561) and that annual adjustments be made using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) All Urban Consumers for Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim.

Alternately, the City Council as an inflator:

- Annual cap or percentage of CPI cap, or
- Future salary increases can be implemented based on annual adjustments (up and down) to salary be made to stay aligned with the median income using the US Census Bureau report, or a similar report published by the State of California, similar to Santa Barbara's measure.

Fiscal Impact:

- •The filing fees for a ballot measure in the upcoming November 2018 election will be approximately \$10,200.
- GF Impact FY 18-19 (Assuming recommended increase in January 2019)
 - \$109,550 or \$163,430 when including benefits
- Annualized a GF Impact
 - \$219,000 or \$326,860 when including benefits

Upon direction, City Attorney's office will bring ballot language for final approval on June 5th, followed by the Resolutions calling for the General Municipal Election and Consolidation of a General Municipal Election on June 19th for all ballot measures and general election.
