Mayor Perotte and Council Members,

COAST supports the development of a new fire station in this neighborhood, but requests that this be used as an opportunity to strengthen active transportation and public transit networks. This could be a great opportunity to close bicycle network gaps on Hollister in the station vicinity and create a project consistent with the recently adopted Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. As shown in the picture below, the existing class II bicycle lane abruptly ends on the north side of Hollister at the end of The Hideaway housing development to continue again at the right-hand turn lane for Cathedral Oaks.

Additionally, this would be a prime opportunity to create a developed bus shelter for SBMTD bus stop 960. Current conditions leave bus riders standing in the shoulder of the road without anywhere to sit. The bus stop does not seem to be reflected in the proposed plans.

We appreciate the City of Goleta's continued commitment to active transportation and hope this can be reflected in this project.
