



GRANTS Harwood Community Conversations

- Harwood Institute for Public Innovation is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization equipping organizations with tools to tackle challenges
- City of Goleta received grant in summer of 2018
- Harwood assisting in gathering data about public's aspirations for its community. Goleta Valley Library using version of Harwood questions to ascertain what population of Library Zone 4 wants most
- Goleta staff pushed Isla Vista groups to the top of Harwood conversation process
- Data gathering process will conclude at end of 2019 with written assessment of library service needs within Zone 4, including Isla Vista
- Held event at Goleta Valley Community Center
- Harwood conversation at Maravilla, great results!
