HISTORY

- In February of 2018, the City of Goleta kicked off the Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan Process
- In June of 2019, a draft was reviewed at the Parks and Recreation Commission meeting
- In August of 2019, a revised draft was reviewed and, with changes, was recommended for Council Consideration
- On January 16, 2019, the City Council reviewed, amended and adopted the Goleta Parks, Facilities and Playgrounds Master Plan (Plan), providing direction to staff to have the Parks & Recreation Commission prioritize the recommendations

PRIORITIZATION PROCESS

- Commissioners were asked to review the recommendations/goals and objectives from the Plan
- Commissioners were asked to complete a worksheet of the recommendations that would provide a starting point for tonight's discussion
- As the worksheet is populated with input from the Commission, the recommendations will be presented in ascending order, based on the cumulative average of the Commission's responses
- This will be our starting point for this evening's discussion

POINTS OF CONSIDERATION

- The Commission is an advisory body to the City Council
- There are a few recommendations that may be perceived as a best practice, rather than a specific task
- There are some recommendations that may require a City General Plan amendment
- The Commission has received public comment from the Audubon Society related to this topic
- Prior to deliberations, the Commission may want to hear from members of the public
