- SUBJECT: Proposition 218: Protest Hearing for Proposed Solid Waste Rate Increase

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. Conduct a public hearing to accept both written and verbal protests against the increased solid waste fees, track the number of protests and, if the number of written protests received is not sufficient to constitute a majority, make a finding that there is not a majority protest by property owners within the assessment area.
- B. Adopt Resolution No. 20-___ entitled, "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Goleta, California, Increasing Solid Waste Maximum Rates."

BACKGROUND:

On April 5, 2011, the City of Goleta approved Franchise Agreement 2011-023 (Agreement) with MarBorg Industries (MarBorg) to provide city-wide residential and commercial solid waste collection services, effective from July 1, 2011 until June 30, 2019. On August 15, 2017 the City Council approved a two-year extension, until June 30, 2021, requested by MarBorg under an option to extend.

On September 5, 2017, the City Council approved Amendment No. 1 to the Franchise Agreement between the City and MarBorg Industries to reflect an adjustment to Fiscal Year (FY) 2017/18 Solid Waste Collection Rates. On July 17, 2018, the City Council approved Amendment No. 2 to, among other things, enhance collection services, reduce solid waste collection rates, and extend the franchise term by 10 years, through June 30, 2031. On June 18, 2019 the City Council last approve a rate increase for Marborg under the terms of the Franchise Agreement. The overall rate increase was for 15.56%. The increase became effective on July 19, 2019.

The process for the Proposition 218 Hearing is summarized below:

- 1. Mail out a public notice (Attachment 1) 45 days in advance of the public hearing that includes:
 - a) A description of the reasons for the cost increase
 - b) The proposed rate increases

c) The Public Hearing date and time

The notice is to be mailed to all affected parties, i.e., property owners and tenants.

- 2. The Proposition 218 Hearing is held in accordance with the California Constitution Article XIIID. City Council shall consider all written and oral comments received. Oral comments are not considered formal protest unless accompanied with a written protest. Only one objection is permitted per person billed. An objection must include: the property owner/customer information; the associated parcel; and the name and signature of the customer submitting a protest. Due to the COVID-19 issues, the City is accepting written protests via email to cityclerkgroup@cityofgoleta.org.
- 3. If protests against the rate increase are not received from a majority of the property owners or customers on record, then the City Council is authorized to impose the rate changes as adopted by resolution.
- 4. Once the resolution is adopted, a notice will be mailed to all affected parties that the rate increase will be effective in 30 days.

The Franchise Agreement includes a provision for annual adjustments to the solid waste collection rates charged to residential and commercial subscribers by setting a not-to-exceed cap on the rates, called the "Maximum Rate." MarBorg may set annual collection rates at, or below, the Maximum Rate established in the Agreement. In accordance with Section 12.2, Adjustment of Rates, MarBorg must submit a formal request for rate increase and supporting documentation sixty (60) days prior to the adjustment of the Maximum Rates. Any approved rate increase is to be effective on July 1.

The Agreement allows collection costs to be adjusted to reflect inflationary increases, based upon the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim Consumer Price Index (CPI) as published by the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. Additionally, the disposal cost category may be adjusted to reflect changes in the fee charged by the County of Santa Barbara to accept refuse at the Tajiguas Landfill (the "tipping fee").

DISCUSSION:

FY 2020/21 Solid Waste Collection Rates

On March 20, 2020, Public Works staff received a request for a rate increase from MarBorg Industries (MarBorg) (Attachment 2). The rate increase is clarified below:

 As defined by the Franchise Agreement, the rates are categorized into a service component and a disposal component. The service component is adjusted based on the change in the CPI and the disposal component is adjusted based on actual tipping fee costs. In accordance with the franchise agreement, the service component equates to 59.5% of the rate and the disposal component equates to 40.5% of the rate.

- Public Works staff has reviewed and verified that the CPI presented by MarBorg when calculated using a February 2019 February 2020 change is 3.4%. That 3.4% is then multiplied by the service component percentage and the total acceptable CPI increase to the rate is 2.02% (3.4% X 59.5% = 2.02%).
- 3) Public Works staff reviewed the tipping fee increase request which includes the following:
 - Santa Barbara County Trash and Recycling fee increase from \$150.00/ton to \$158.00/ton
 - Santa Barbara County Green Waste fee increase from \$46.00/ton to \$50.00/ton

Note that both increases are associated with the Tajiguas ReSource Center that is currently under construction and will ultimately divert at least 60% of the material currently collected in the refuse bins. The project includes a new facility to pull the recyclables out of the trash waste stream and an anaerobic digester to process all organic materials. When completed, the facility will increase the area's recycling rates upwards of 85%, generate green energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The facility is scheduled to be operational in 2021.

Public Works staff has reviewed and verified that the disposal component increase is 5.5%. That 5.5% is then multiplied by the disposal component percentage and the total acceptable increase to the disposal component rate is 2.23% (5.5% X 40.5% = 2.23%).

4) The overall rate increase is 4.25% (2.02% +2.23% = 4.25%).

If the City Council approves the rate increase by Resolution (Attachment 3), the approved rates will be effective July 1, 2020. The impact to residential and commercial rate payers is shown in the following table of select residential and commercial rates. The full rate schedule is included in Attachment 4.

<u>Contract Compliance</u>: As part of processing a rate increase request and in accordance with Section 4.5.1 Satisfactory Performance, Public Works staff has verified MarBorg's compliance with the conditions of the franchise agreement. Below is a summary of critical areas Public Works staff has reviewed.

 Diversion compliance: In accordance with the franchise agreement Amendment 2, MarBorg is required to maintain a minimum combined commercial and residential diversion of 41.5%. The diversion is indicated below, and MarBorg is in compliance with the agreement:

 Customer Satisfaction: On a monthly basis MarBorg provides the City with a list of complaints received and their resolution. Most complaints are relative to missed pick up, carts placed out late or extra material placed out for collection. There are no longstanding unresolved issues that need addressing.

- **Timely Payment of fees**: MarBorg pays all fees to the City on time and in accordance with the Franchise Agreement.
- Competitive Rate Guarantee: Public Works staff has reviewed the existing rates of the County of Santa Barbara and the proposed rates of the City of Santa Barbara. While the actual service level and days of service vary between agencies, the City of Goleta rates are equal to or lower than the surrounding area. This is in accordance with Section 12.3 of the Franchise Agreement, Competitive Rate Guarantee.
- Special Collections: MarBorg provides special collection services (Bulky Items, Batteries, E-Waste and White Goods) at no additional expense. Each residential property is entitled to two (2) on-call services per fiscal year. These collections include bulky item collections. Bulky items include furniture, white goods, green waste, electronic-waste, fluorescent bulbs, household batteries and clothing. Note that electronic-waste and white goods are in an unlimited quantity.
- Sharps and Goleta Buyback Center: MarBorg continues to provide a mail back program for sharps and access, at no additional cost, to the Goleta Buyback Center. This center accepts antifreeze, batteries, oil, paint, fluorescent bulbs, compact disks, cell phone, computers, televisions, and other electronic waste.
- Participation in local events and Community Clean ups: MarBorg continues to proactively participate in local clean up events including Beautify Goleta, Beach and Creek clean ups, etc.

Through this contract review process, it is apparent that MarBorg's dedication to the City of Goleta has proven a good partnership with the City. It is the conclusion of the Public Works Department that the contractor, MarBorg Industries, is in compliance with the Franchise Agreement and has faithfully submitted the request for the rate increase. Therefore, Public Works staff through the writing of this report supports the findings to recommend the requested rate increase pending the receipt of any letters of concern from the public.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The combined cost of the mailing for the public hearing and the 30-day notice prior to implementation is approximately \$20,000 and will be covered by available fund balance in the Solid Waste Fund, Fund 211 in current Fiscal Year 20/21.

Under the Franchise Agreement, the City's General Fund receives an annual \$100,000 base Franchise Fee, monthly 5% Franchise Fee, and the City's Public Works Department (Solid Waste Fund) receives an 8% Solid Waste Program Fee from MarBorg on a monthly basis. These fees are calculated on the adjusted gross monthly revenue derived from franchise collection operations in the City and remitted to the City on a monthly basis. Because these fees are based on a percentage of the Franchisee's monthly rate revenue, any increase in rates will result in an increase to the fees paid to the City. Under the Agreement's rate model, all residential and commercial rates are

increased uniformly. Thus the 5% Franchise Fee and the 8% Solid Waste Program Fees paid to the City will see an increase of 4.25%. The Two-Year Budget Plan for FY 2020/21 currently reflects status quo amounts with minor increases to reflect changes to service levels. Public Works staff will continue to monitor activity levels and rate impacts and may recommend a mid-year adjustment if necessary.

ALTERNATIVES:

Council may elect to not approve the rate increase at this time. In doing so, the existing rates will remain in place. At that time MarBorg may, in accordance with Section 19.1.3 Notice of Appeal, file a notice of appeal citing its factual contentions and provide all associated back-up documentation. Within 30 days of receipt of the appeal the City Manager shall decide on the matter, per agreement.

ATTENTION: Pursuant to of the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 dated March 17, 2020 authorizing local jurisdictions subject to the Brown Act to hold public meetings telephonically and electronically in order to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, the regular meeting of the City Council for May 19, 2020 will be conducted telephonically and electronically. It will be broadcast live on the City's website and on Cable Goleta Channel 19. The Council Chambers will not be open to the public during the meeting. Councilmembers will be participating telephonically and will not be physically present in the Council Chambers.

PROPOSED RATE CHANGES

You are receiving this Notice because our records indicate that you are a City of Goleta resident/tenant/property owner. The Notice describes the proposed trash and recycling rate changes, and explains how you can file a protest to this increase and participate in the Proposition 218 process. This notice applies to the services that appear on your MarBorg trash and recycling bill.

All current solid waste collection rates include a collection and a disposal component. The City's Franchise Agreement with the waste hauler (MarBorg Industries) allows the rates for solid waste collection services to be adjusted on an annual basis to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index ("CPI") or inflation and changes in disposal costs. The proposed rate schedule includes a total increase for all sectors by 4.25% due to inflation (2.02%) and increased trash disposal fees (2.23%). These increases are explained below.

Collection Cost Increase:

The annual adjustment for inflation or CPI is authorized pursuant to Government Code Section 53756 and is applied to MarBorg's collection related costs only. Collection costs include but are not limited to employee salaries, purchase and maintenance of collection trucks and other equipment, fuel, insurance, workman's compensation insurance, administrative and overhead costs. The CPI adjustment is based on the February to February changes in the Consumer Price Index, as prepared and published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. When calculated in accordance with the Franchise Agreement, the CPI increase is 2.02%.

Disposal Cost Increase:

The City is working with the County of Santa Barbara and other regional cities to construct the Resource Recovery Project, a regional waste processing plant that will divert over 60% of our brown bin waste from landfill disposal. To do this, the project includes a facility that will pull out recyclables mistakenly sent to the landfill and an anaerobic digester to process organic material. Among the project's most significant achievements will be an increase in our regions recycling rate to above 85%, the generation of green energy, and the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions in our region equivalent to taking 24,000 cars off the road every year. The facility is currently being constructed at the Tajiguas landfill and is expected to begin processing our waste in 2021. To fund the construction of the Resource Recovery Project, the fee for receiving trash and recycling from the City of Goleta is increasing from \$150 per ton to \$158 per ton on July 1, 2020. This cost increase is the reason for the 2.23% increase in disposal costs.

Proposed Rate Structure

The above increases are shown in further detail in the following table and are representative of residential and commercial collection rates. If approved, these increased rates will be effective on July 1, 2020.

If you wish to protest any of the above increases, you must mail or deliver your protest <u>signed and in writing</u>, including your name and service address or assessor parcel number to the **City Clerk of the City of Goleta at 130 Cremona Drive, Suite B, Goleta, CA 93117**. On the envelope please note: **Attn: Public Hearing of Solid Waste Rate Changes**. A protest letter can be done by any property owner or tenant (i.e. a customer of record) directly responsible for the payment of solid waste collection fees. Only one protest will be counted per identified address/parcel.

IN LIGHT OF THE CITY'S NEED TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETINGS ELECTRONICALLY AND TELEPHONICALLY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, written protests may also be submitted as instructed above vial email to cityclerkgroup@cityofgoleta.org or by other electronic means during the Public Hearing (date and time noted above), provided they are received prior to the conclusion of the public comment portion of the Public Hearing. IF YOU DO NOT OBJECT TO THE ADJUSTMENTS, NO ACTION IS REQUIRED

The City Council will hear and consider all protests to the proposed rate changes at the Public Hearing. Oral comments at the Public Hearing will not qualify as formal protests unless accompanied by a written and signed protest. At the conclusion of the Public Hearing, the City Council will consider adoption of a resolution authorizing an amendment to the franchise agreement that would allow for the rate changes and CPI increase to the solid waste service rates as described herein. If written protests against the proposed rate changes are not received by a majority of property owners or customers of record in the city limits then the City Council will be authorized to impose the rate changes. If approved, the proposed rate changes will be in effect on July 1, 2020. A separate notice reflecting the approved rate increases will be sent to all customers.

This protest hearing is being conducted in accordance with Article XIIID of the California Constitution and Proposition 218. Please note that a rate protest proceeding is not an election. To ensure transparency and accountability in the rate protest tabulation, protests shall constitute a disclosable public record from and after the time they are received.

ATENCIÓN: De conformidad con la Orden Ejecutiva N-29-20 del Gobernador del 17 de marzo de 2020 que autoriza a las jurisdicciones locales sujetas a la Ley Brown a realizar reuniones públicas por vía telefónica y electrónica para responder a la pandemia COVID-19, la reunión ordinaria del Ayuntamiento de 19 de mayo de 2020 se llevará a cabo por vía telefónica y electrónica. CAMBIOS DE TARIFA PROPUESTOS

Está recibiendo este aviso porque nuestros registros indican que usted es residente / inquilino / propietario de la ciudad de Goleta. El aviso describe los cambios propuestos en la tasa de basura y reciclaje, y explica cómo puede presentar una protesta por este aumento y participar en el proceso de la Proposición 218. Este aviso se aplica a los servicios que aparecen en su factura de basura y reciclaje de MarBorg.

Todas las tasas actuales de recolección de residuos sólidos incluyen un componente de recolección y disposición. El Acuerdo de franquicia de la Ciudad con el transportista de residuos (MarBorg Industries) permite que las tarifas de los servicios de recolección de residuos sólidos se ajusten anualmente para reflejar los cambios en el Índice de precios al consumidor ("IPC") o la inflación y los cambios en los costos de eliminación. El cronograma de tarifas propuesto incluye un aumento total para todos los sectores en 4.25% debido a la inflación (2.02%) y el aumento de las tarifas de eliminación de basura (2.23%). Estos aumentos se explican a continuación.

Aumento de costos de recolección:

El ajuste anual por inflación o CPI está autorizado de conformidad con la Sección 53756 del Código de Gobierno y se aplica únicamente a los costos relacionados con el cobro de MarBorg. Los costos de recolección incluyen, entre otros, los salarios de los empleados, la compra y el mantenimiento de camiones de recolección y otros equipos, combustible, seguro, seguro de compensación para trabajadores, costos administrativos y gastos generales. El ajuste del IPC se basa en los cambios de febrero a febrero en el Índice de Precios al Consumidor, según lo preparado y publicado por la Oficina de Estadísticas Laborales de EE. UU. Cuando se calcula de acuerdo con el Acuerdo de franquicia, el aumento del IPC es del 2.02%.

Aumento de costos de eliminación:

La Ciudad está trabajando con el Condado de Santa Bárbara y otras ciudades regionales para construir el Proyecto de Recuperación de Recursos, una planta regional de procesamiento de desechos que desviará más del 60% de nuestros desechos de la basura marrón de la disposición en vertederos. Para hacer esto, el proyecto incluye una instalación que extraerá los reciclables enviados por error al vertedero y un digestor anaeróbico para procesar material orgánico. Entre los logros más importantes del proyecto estará un aumento en la tasa de reciclaje de nuestras regiones por encima del 85%, la generación de energía verde y la reducción de las emisiones de gases de efecto invernadero en nuestra región, lo que equivale a sacar de la carretera a 24,000 automóviles cada año. La instalación se está construyendo actualmente en el vertedero de Tajiguas y se espera que comience a procesar nuestros desechos en 2021. Para financiar la construcción del % 150 por tonelada a \$ 158 por tonelada el 1 de julio de 2020. Este aumento de costos es la razón del aumento de 2.23% en los costos de disposición.

Estructura de tarifas propuesta

Los aumentos anteriores se muestran con más detalle en la siguiente tabla y son representativos de las tasas de cobro residencial y comercial. Si se aprueba, estas tasas aumentadas entrarán en vigor el 11 de julio de 2020.

Ms. Nilsson,

As outlined in MarBorg's contract with the City of Goleta, Article 12, Section 12.2, rates shall be adjusted each July 1. The method of determining this rate adjustment is defined by Amendment 1, approved September 5, 2017. Section 12.2.1 of this amendment states that the Contractor's Recurring Rate Revenue shall be organized into a Service Component and Material Tipping Fee Component. The Service Component shall be adjusted based on the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The Material Tipping Fee Component shall be adjusted to reimburse the Contract for its actual Material Tipping Fee Cost.

Based on the monthly billing from July 2019 through February 2020, and the actual material tipping fees, the weighting of the above components is as follows:

The change in CPI from February 2019 to February 2020 is 3.4%, as determined by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.¹ This value was determined for the Los Angeles - Long Beach - Anaheim, CA local area. The relevant page from the BLS report is attached. An increase of 3.4% of the Service Component results in an additional \$193,538 in annual revenue.

In addition, on July 1st, 2020, we expect the County of Santa Barbara to raise the tipping fee for both trash and recycling from \$150 to \$158/ton, and the greenwaste tipping fee from \$46 to \$50/ton. These tipping fee increases are set by the County in preparation for the Tajiguas Resource Recovery Project, and have been agreed to by the City of Goleta. While the trash and recycling rate has been released by the County in their February 3, 2020 Meeting Agenda

(attached), the greenwaste rates were not released at the same time. Should the greenwaste tip fee be less than MarBorg's estimated \$50/ton, MarBorg will decrease the proposed rates accordingly.

During the 2019 year, MarBorg collected 28,623 tons of trash, recycling, and organics from Goleta. We have estimated that the same volume and type of material will be collected in the 2020/2021 year. This will amount to approximately \$213,013 in increased tipping fees over the course of the year, a 5.5% increase over the current tip fees.

The overall effect on the rates is as follows:

An increase of 3.4% on 59.5% of the revenue is 2.02% (.034 x .595 = .0202).

An increase of 5.5% on 40.5% of the revenue is 2.23% (.055 x .405 = .0223).

The sum of these two components is an overall rate increase of 4.25%. These calculations are supported by current and projected revenues, which are attached.

Based on these calculations, we propose the attached rates for the 2020/2021 year. All rates have been increased by 4.25% over the current rates.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-XX

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLETA, CALIFORNIA, INCREASING SOLID WASTE MAXIMUM RATES

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLETA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

On Tuesday, May 19, 2020, the City Council held a duly noticed protest hearing with respect to the solid waste maximum rates. All affected property owners were given notice of the hearing on April 1, 2020 and given an opportunity to protest. The City received written protests for __properties prior to the protest hearing and an additional __ written protests were received at the public hearing. A total of __ written protests were received before the close of the hearing.

For purposes of determining whether a majority protest exists for each type of parcel, the protests were also tabulated for commercial, condominium, multi-family residential and single-family residential. The number of written protests received was not sufficient to constitute a majority protest. The City Clerk has certified the tabulation of written protests.

SECTION 2.

Section 53756 of the California Government Code authorizes the City to adopt a schedule of fees or charges authorizing automatic adjustments for inflation provided that the City Council adopts such schedule of fees or charges for a period not to exceed five years. The City Council hereby accepts the City Clerk's certification of the results of the protest hearing and adopts the increase in solid waste collection fees for CPI and tipping fee increases as follows:

- a) Beginning July 1, 2020 and through June 30, 2021, the Service Component of the Maximum Rates shall be increased 2.02% percent, which reflects the change in the Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County Consumer Price Index (CPI), from February 2019 to February 2020, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- b) Beginning July 1, 2020 and through June 30, 2021, the Material Tipping Fee Cost component of the Maximum Rates will be increased

by 2.23% percent to reflect the increase to the refuse, recycling and green waste tipping fees as established by Santa Barbara County.

SECTION 3.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
