Why is the parking against the curb? I understand that best practice is for it to be the other way around, i.e. the bike lane is against the curb, with the parked cars between the bike lane and the travel lane.

Mayor Perotte and Councilmembers:

The staff report for this item recommends that your council approve a new Hollister Avenue Old Town Interim Striping Project and direct staff to initiate project design based on a two-lane Hollister Avenue (Alternative B).

That alternative would reduce traffic on Hollister Avenue to one travel lane in each direction, add two Class II bike lanes along Hollister Avenue, and provide reverse angle parking on portions of the north side of Hollister Avenue as well as 8-foot wide parallel parking along the south side. As proposed in the staff report, the parking lanes are adjacent to the sidewalk. I wish to raise the following points.

First, given that even an interim project can remain in place for years, I hope that staff and council have given or will give in-depth consideration to the wisdom of narrowing the only feasible emergency exit from our residential neighborhoods to two lanes before making a final decision even on a project with a temporary life. Hollister Avenue is more than a commercial and travel corridor: it is vital to any evacuation effort, certainly in Old Town and perhaps for the wider community.

According to the *Los Angeles Times* on November 20, 2018, the town of "Paradise narrowed its main road through town as well as two other streets in recent years, hoping to slow traffic and improve pedestrian safety. The changes came despite warnings that a major fire would cause crippling gridlock during evacuations, a scenario that became grim reality when California's worst wildfire swept into Paradise this month."

The staff report suggests that our community may be living with any interim project that you might approve for quite some time given the complexities and expense of a final project. What steps are proposed to ensure public safety under emergency conditions during the interim and under any permanent project? Any existing evacuation plans would be premised on a four-lane Hollister Avenue. New plans would need to be devised upon adoption of a two-lane option.

Second, some are asking that the parking lanes be moved out away from the sidewalk and that the bike lanes be installed between the parking lanes and the sidewalk. This option seems inadvisable because, under this scenario:

- Drivers and passengers would need to cross the bike lanes upon exiting or returning to their cars, thus interrupting travel in the bike lanes
- Cyclists traveling in a lane situated between parked cars and the sidewalk would be less visible to drivers making right turns

Third, more attention needs to be given to the impact of traffic on cross-streets. What impact will the changes on Hollister Avenue have on wait times for residents (and customers in some cases) as they attempt to exit onto Hollister Avenue?

Balancing the many interests involved in Old Town improvements is a complicated task. Thank you for your efforts.
