











December 14, 2020 Meeting Comments

- Reconsider the level of Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) review authority and the make-up/number of the HPC.
- Consider if it is best practice to allow HPC to submit nominations for designation.
- Add economic hardship as a factor in the consideration of granting a Mills Act contract.
- Increase length of time to getting a building permit after demolishing without approval for non-residential projects.
- Clarify how ADU requirements correspond with the Ordinance requirements for design review of additions to Historic Resources.
- Provide more information as to why each property is proposed to be placed on the proposed Eligibility List, and which building on the property is referenced in the evaluation.

Historic Preservation Ordinance: Revisions

- Maintain the intent of the Ordinance, while fine-tuning and streamlining per other City regulations and procedures
- Ensure consistency between Historic
 Preservation Chapter and previously adopted regulations and procedures
- Procedural information removed
- Removal of Planning Commissioner and DRB member from make-up of HPC
- "Point of Interest" designation category changed to "Point of Historical Interest"



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Historic Preservation Ordinance: Revisions

- Conservation Overlay Zone category removed; will be handled under existing Overlay District provisions
- Alterations section revised to correspond to existing DRB process & provide more clarity for property owners
- Economic hardship built into both the Maintenance and Demolition sections
- Guidelines and procedures for Mills Act applications to be developed separately

Historic Preservation Commission Additional Discussion

- Considerations of establishing separate HPC:
 - Staff time
 - Cost
 - Sufficient work for commission
 - Expertise
- Reconsider incorporating responsibilities into existing Review Authority







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Historic Resources Inventory: Updates

- Refined Inventory based on Planning Commission & community feedback
- Recommending those properties most representative of their style, type, or period be included on the initial Inventory
- Evaluations based on comparative analysis from citywide survey and themes in the historic context statement
- Remaining properties included on a Study List for future consideration

Historic Resources Inventory

- 29 properties recommended for inclusion in initial City of Goleta Historic Resources Inventory
 - 7 previously designated (recommended for Landmark status)
 - 21 resources identified in the General Plan
 - 8 newly-identified resources
- 4 Points of Historical Interest
