RECOMMENDATION:

- A. Receive a staff presentation regarding the status of the Santa Barbara Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) Municipal Service Review;
- B. Review and approve staff's proposed responses to the LAFCO Municipal Service Review Report Questionnaire or provide other direction.

BACKGROUND:

The LAFCO is a regional agency that has authority to regulate by adopting spheres of influence (SOI) for each city and special district in the county and by approving or denying city and special district boundary changes (annexations and detachments) and extensions of certain public services.

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 required the LAFCO in each California county to prepare a review of municipal services in geographic areas appropriate to the subject services and to prepare written recommendations with respect to each of the following:

- a. Infrastructure needs or deficiencies
- b. Growth and population projections for the affected area
- c. Financing constraints and opportunities
- d. Cost avoidance opportunities
- e. Opportunities for rate restructuring
- f. Opportunities for shared facilities
- g. Government structure options, including advantages and disadvantages of consolidation or reorganization of service providers.

DISCUSSION:

In a letter dated March 8, 2021, LAFCO Executive Officer Mike Prater notified the City of pending Municipal Service Reviews (MSR) to update the SOIs for the cities and special districts in Santa Barbara County (Attachment 1). Related updates will be prepared to include services related to fire protection, law enforcement, crime and safety, and emergency medical services.

To assist LAFCO with the MSR, a completed MSR Survey and Questionnaire will be transmitted to the Executive Officer by the deadline of May 7, 2021 (Attachment 2). The completed MSR Survey and Questionnaire, as completed by City staff, assume the status quo SOI for the City of Goleta, which aligns with the City limits, and do not propose other changes to district and/or service boundaries.

The purpose of this staff report is to update Council on the MSR Survey and Questionnaire responses and to receive related input. Additionally, staff seeks Council approval to transmit the responses to LAFCO before the May 7, 2021 deadline.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

Staff time for this project is included in the Advance Planning Work Program for 2021-22, therefore there are not additional fiscal impacts associated with this item.

Santa Barbara County provides law enforcement and fire services to the City. The City has a Sheriff substation at the El Camino Real Marketplace and hosts Sheriff officers and equipment for the Goleta Motors Unit and parking enforcement services at Goleta City Hall. Fire Station 10 will be a new fire station, approximately 11,600 square feet in size, in western Goleta on a City-owned parcel located at 7952 Hollister Avenue. Following California Coastal Commission permit approval in September 2020, the project moved into final design and development of construction documents. The City intends to go out to bid in Spring-Summer 2021. Construction will begin in 2021 and I expected to take 14 months. Funding for this project is City Fire Facility Development Impact Fees and other developer mitigation fees.
